Municipal waste survey in Kosovo was conducted according to DPSIR model, used by all OECD countries, Eurostat, European Environment Agency (EEA) and in line with the Environment European Agency list of indicators.

1. Objective, methodology of survey

1.1. Objective

Objective of the municipal waste survey 2010 was to obtain information on waste according to;

- Type
- Quantity of collected waste

Also, this publication aims to provide the basis for monitoring municipal waste in the future in this sector.

1.2. Methodology

1.2.1 Frame survey

All the survey procedures were prepared during September – October 2011, activities such as:

Questionnaire preparation, instructions, questionnaire test in the municipal companies that treat (manage) waste before the starting date of the survey.

The prepared material was distributed to all regional statistical of SAK.

1.2.2 Field procedures

Fieldwork was conducted by our collaborators in regional offices who conducted direct interviews with managers of companies in their region, based on questionnaires (Anex 1).

Examination of the data is done at two levels:

- (i) Examination of completed questionnaires in the field by field supervisors.
- (ii) Examination of questionnaires completed at the head office in SAK, the staff of the Department of Statistics of Agriculture and Environment

2. Definition

Municipal waste - is waste from households, as well as waste from other activities which because of their nature and composition, are similar to those of the household.



Figure 2: Structure of the waste collected for Pristina and region





Figure 3: Structure of the collected waste to other regions in Kosovo

In Kosovo, the 2010 data show that the average municipal waste generated was 297 kg per person per year. While significant differences are observed between regions, as for example, in other regions in Kosovo the amount of municipal waste collected was 226 kg per capita per year.

In Kosovo, waste collection door to door was 57 percent, while the collective dwelling was 43 percent.

In other regions in Kosovo municipal waste collection was 45 percent compared to collective dwelling and 55 percent in residential door to door.

In Pristina and its region the amount of municipal waste was 1.4 kg per day per person.

For the rest of Kosovo, the quantity of municipal waste collected per person per day was 0.6 kg (see Table 2).

In 2010, the collection of municipal waste calculated per day per person in Pristina and its region was 1.4 kg, while in other regions of Kosovo 0.6 kg.

In Kosovo, the average waste collected per person per day was 0.8 kg


In Pristina and its region data for 2010 show that there was an increase in waste collection for residents to 17 percent, compared to 2009.

Statistical Agency of Kosovo (SAK) is a professional office operating since 1948. The SAK passed through some of the historic phases and it has been structured by the state rule of that time. SOK restarted its work on August 2, 1999, as an independent and professional office working in the frames of the Ministry of Public Administration (MPA). Since 12.12.2011 the Agency operates in the frames of the Prime Minister's Office. SAK is financed by the Kosovo Consolidated Budget and by donors for the various projects.
