## Geographic information about Kosovo

The Republic of Kosovo has an area of 10,908 km<sup>2</sup>, located on the south-eastern Europe, bordering the south-west with Albania, Montenegro in northwest, and Serbia to the north-east and Macedonia in the south. The territory lies within the geographical widths 41° 51' and 43° 16', and in longitude 19° 59' and 21° 47'.

The territory of the Republic of Kosovo is characterized with different height above sea level. The lowest point of Kosovo is located in the valley of the river 'Drini i Bardhë' (White Drin) on the border with Albania and reaches up to 270 m above sea level, the higher it is in western Kosovo, in Gjeravicë - 2.656 m.

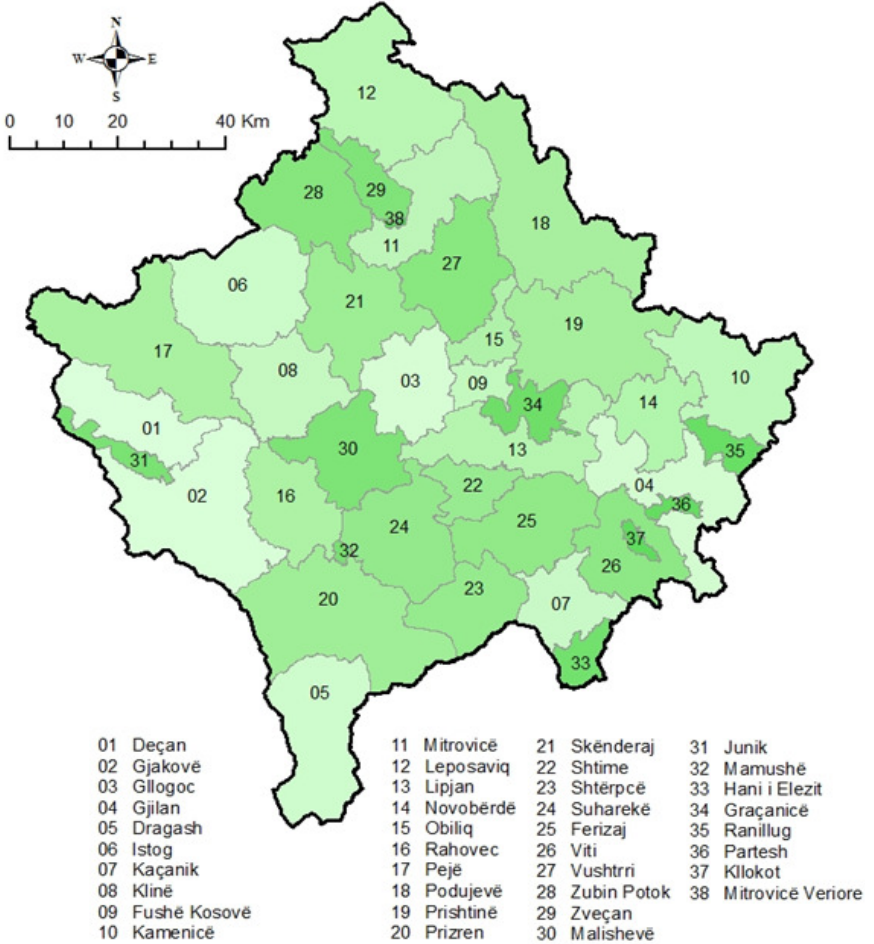
In hydrographic terms, Kosovo is divided into river basins: the Drini i Bardhë, Ibri, Morava e Binçës and Lepenci. Kosovo river flows are discharged into three sea basins: the Black Sea, Adriatic Sea and Aegean Sea.

The climate of the Republic of Kosovo in the most part is continental, resulting in warm summers and cold winters with Mediterranean and continental influences (average temperature within the country range from +30 °C in summer, at -10 °C in winter). However, there are changes in temperature and rainfall distribution due to unequal elevations in certain parts of the country.

Currently there are 38 municipalities with 1,469 settlements organized under the laws of the country.

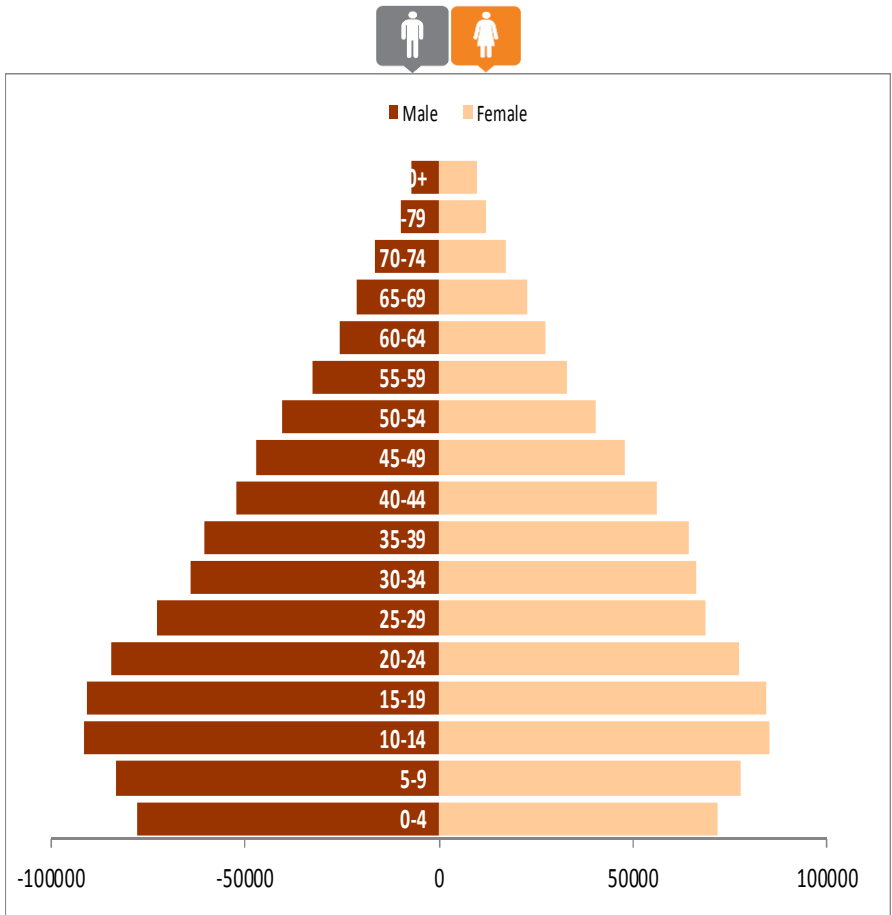

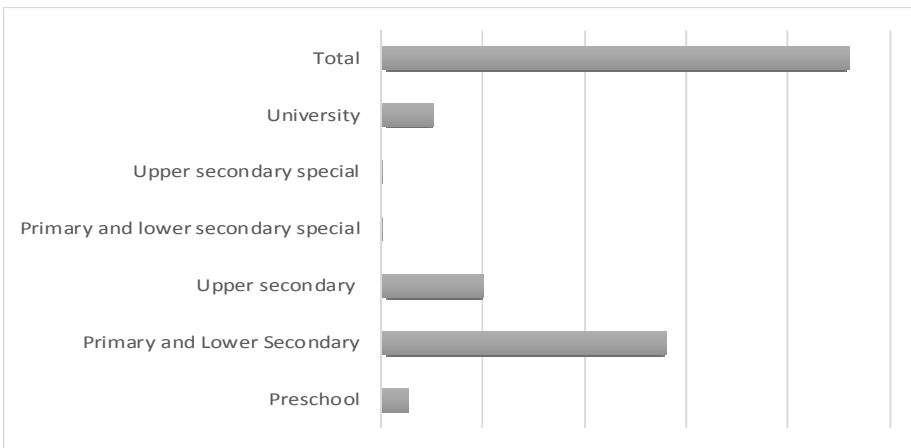

**Graph 2. Number of children, pupils and students in% (public and private education) 2013/2014**

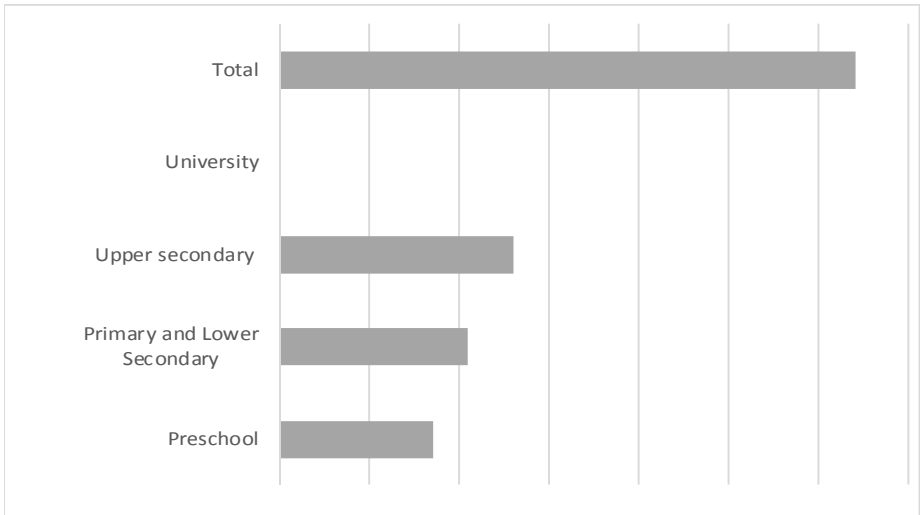

**Graph 3. Number of children, pupils and students in% (private education) 2013/2014**

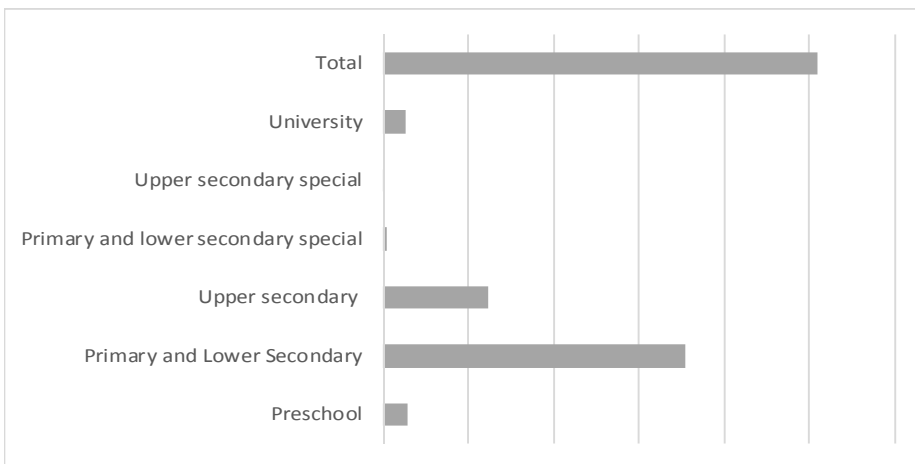

**Graph 4. Number of teachers by the level in % (public and private education) 2013/2014**

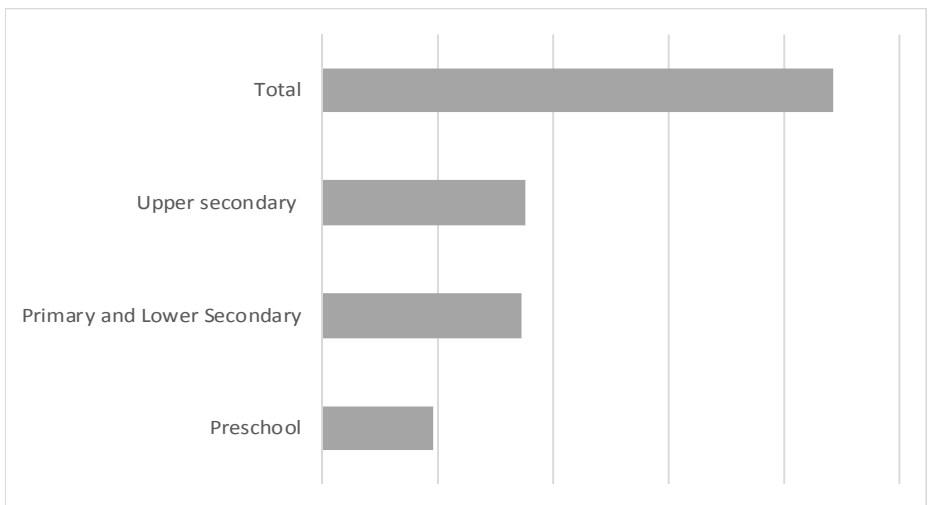

**Graph 5. Number of teachers by the level in % (private education) 2013/2014**



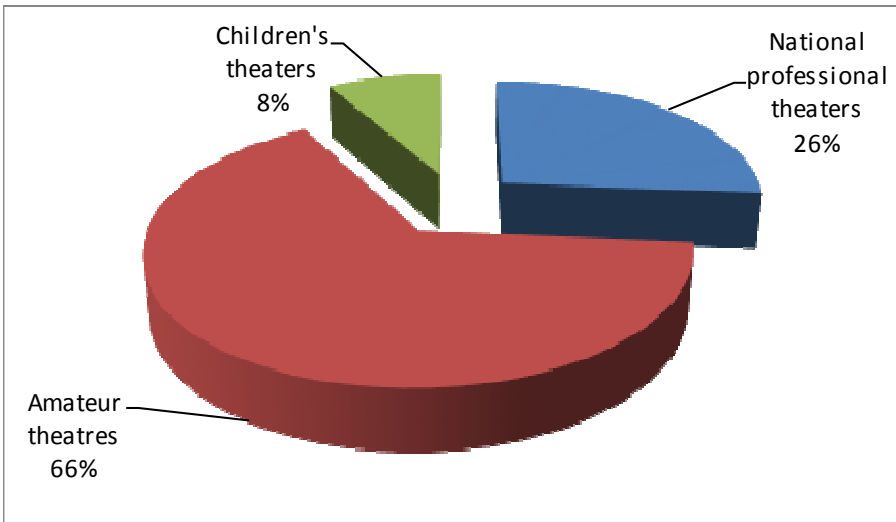

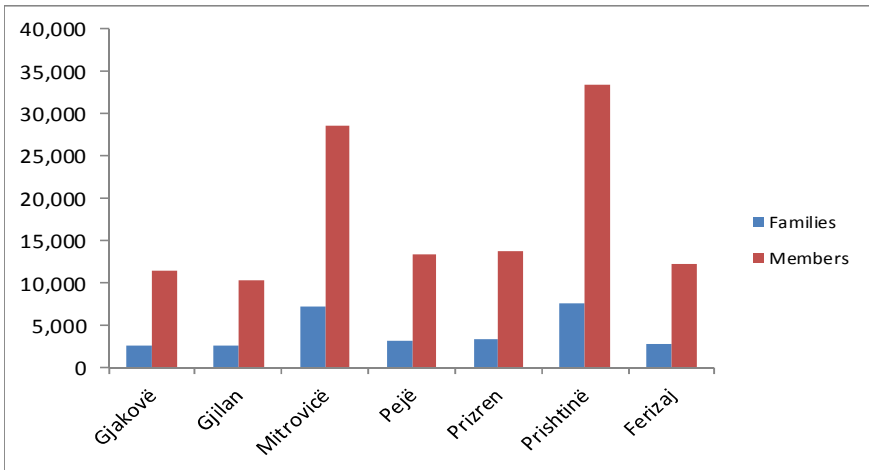

#### Graph 7. Social assistance

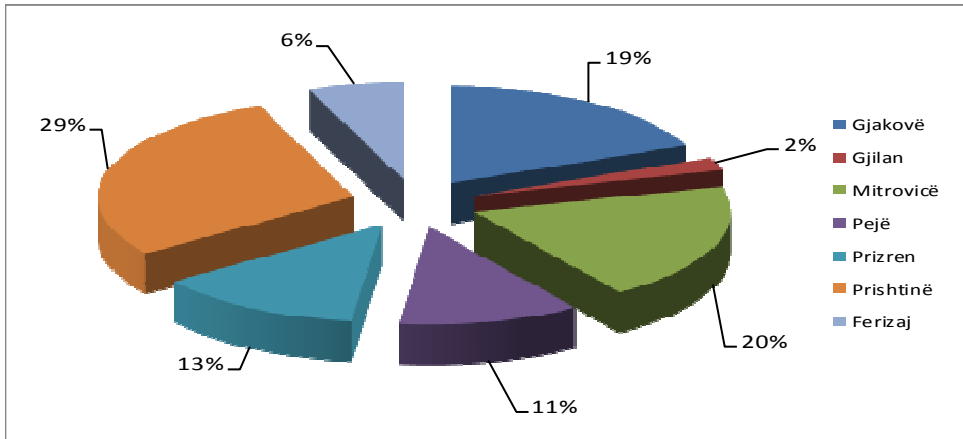

**Graph 8. Families of martyrs and war invalids 2013**

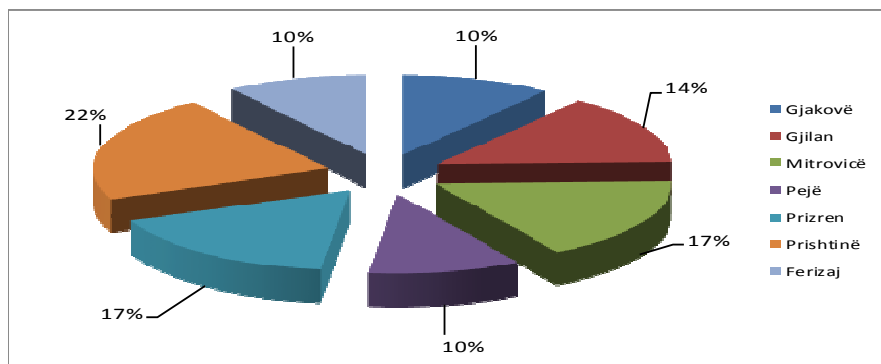

#### Graph 9. Basic pensions 2013

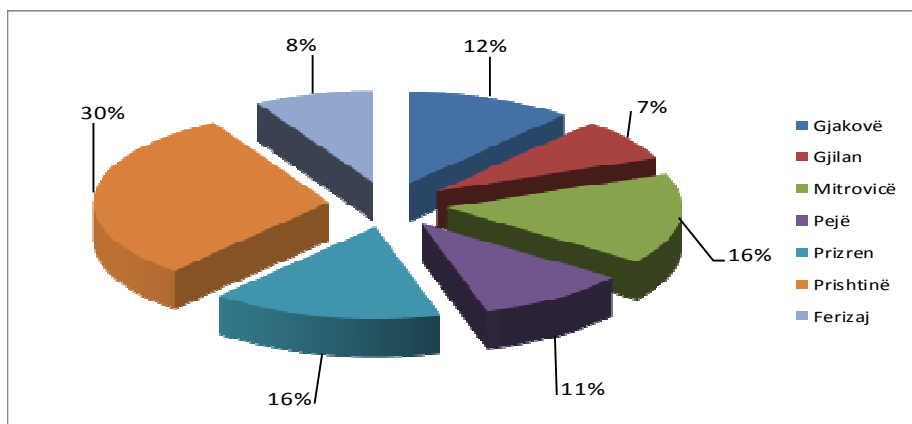

Graph 10. Pension contributors 2013

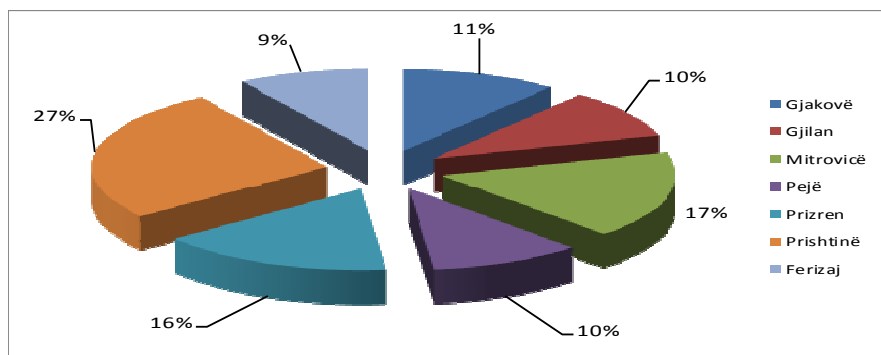

**Graph 11. Pensions of persons with special needs in 2013**

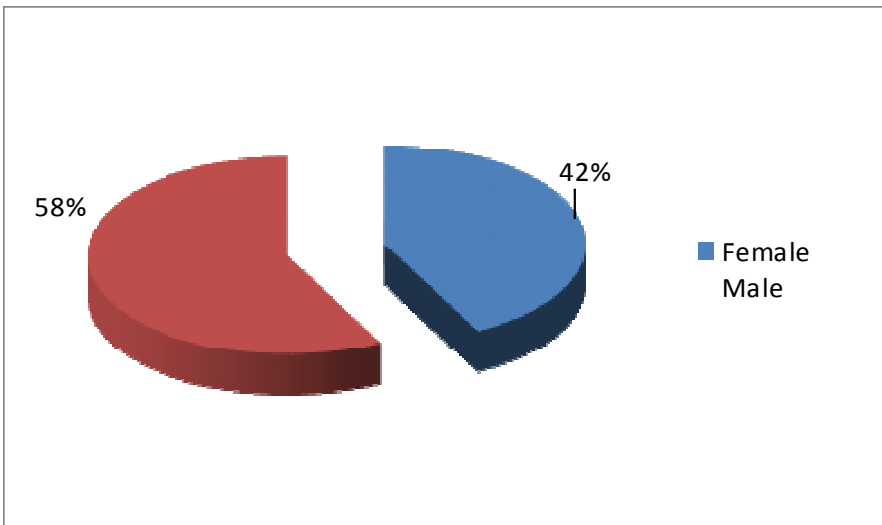

**Graph 12: Abandoned children by the region and month in 2013**



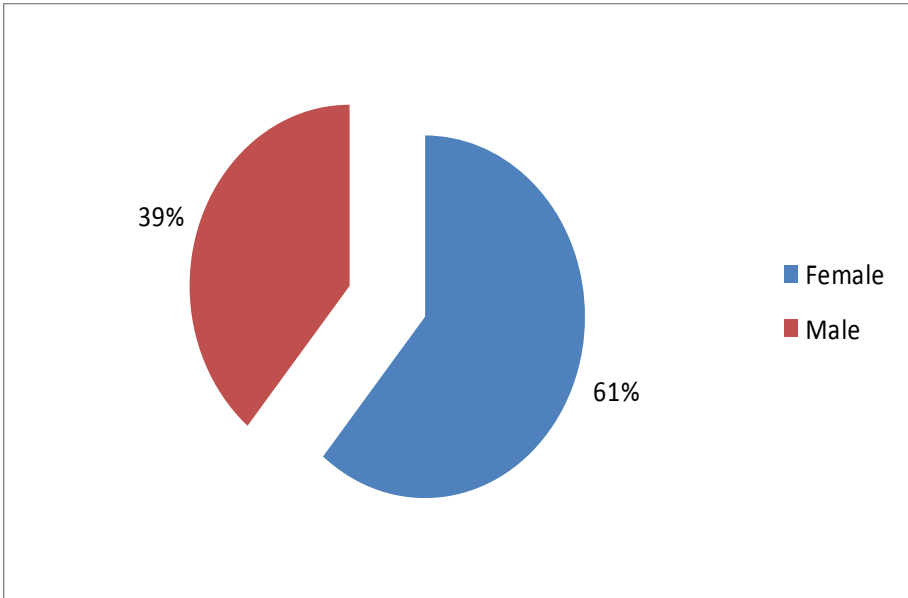

**Graph 13: Gender structure of employees in health institutions**



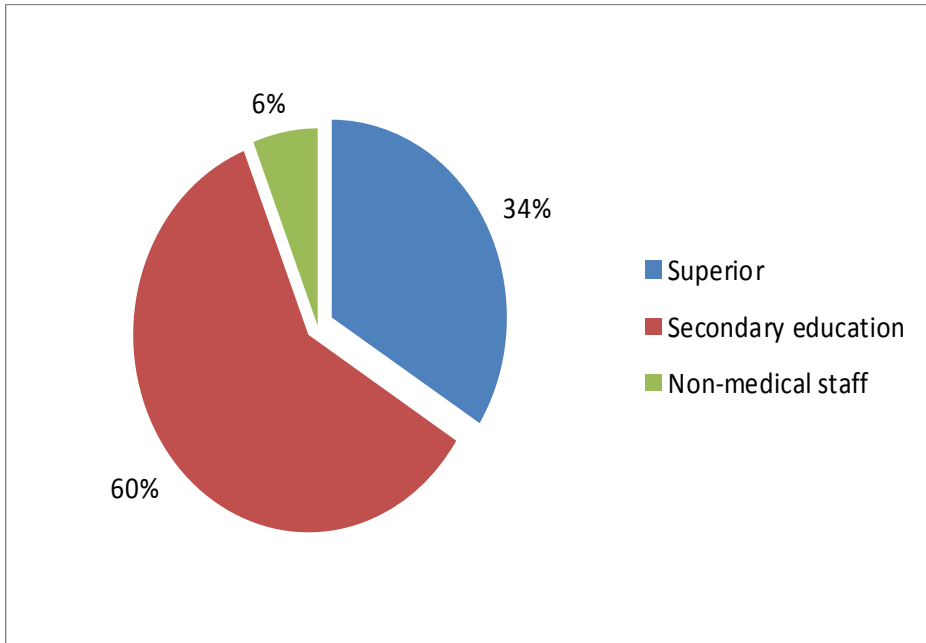

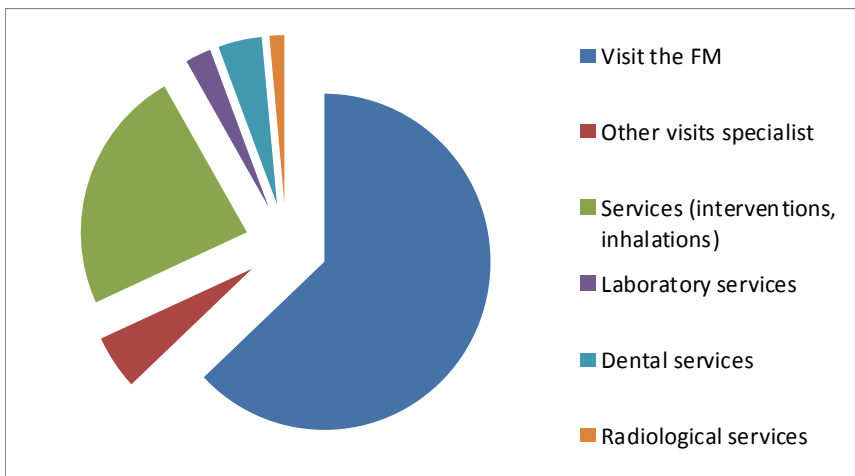

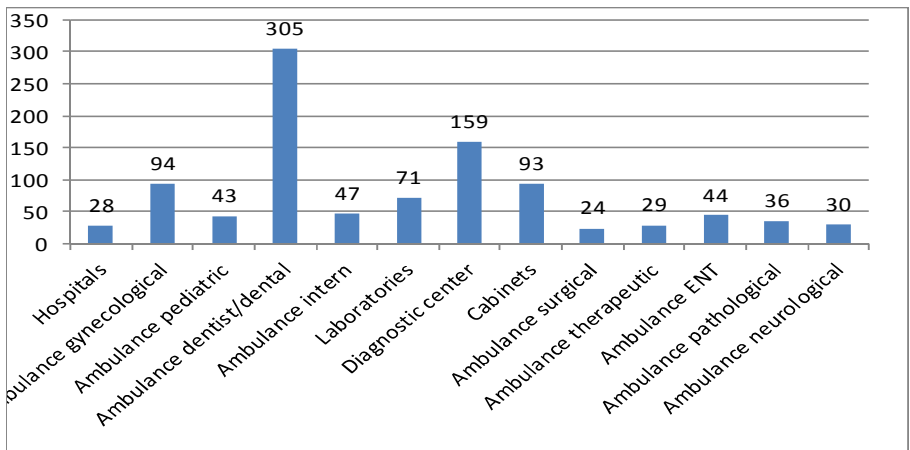

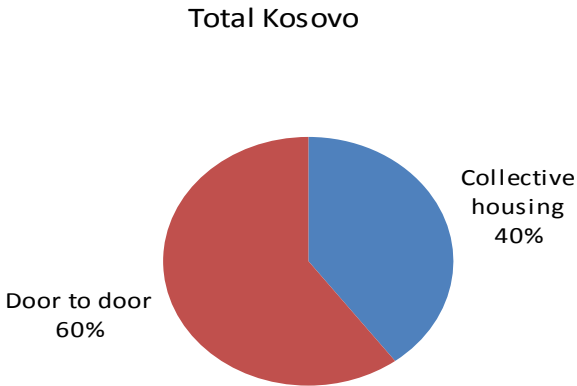

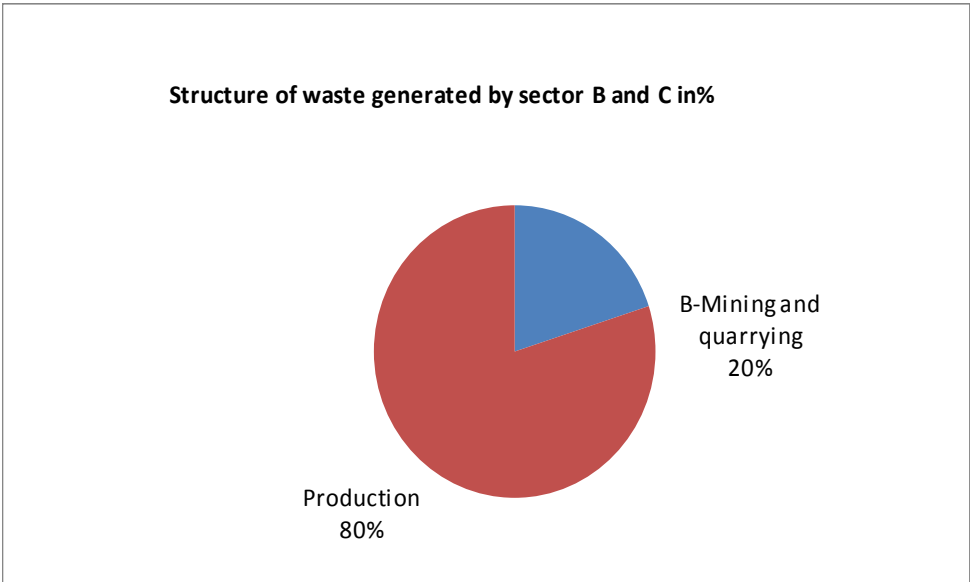

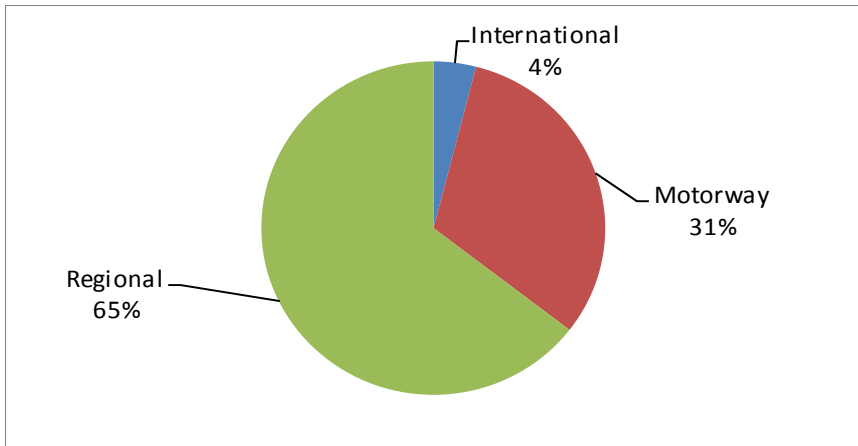

**Graph 19. Categorization of roads according to standards**



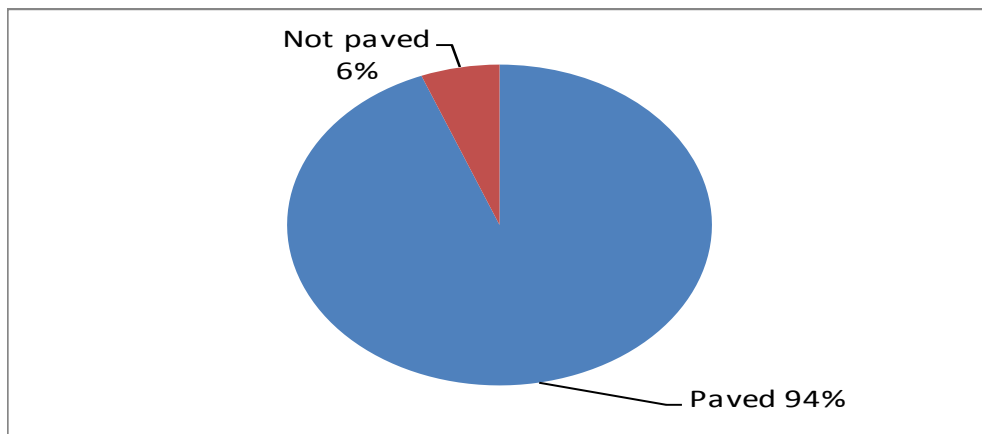

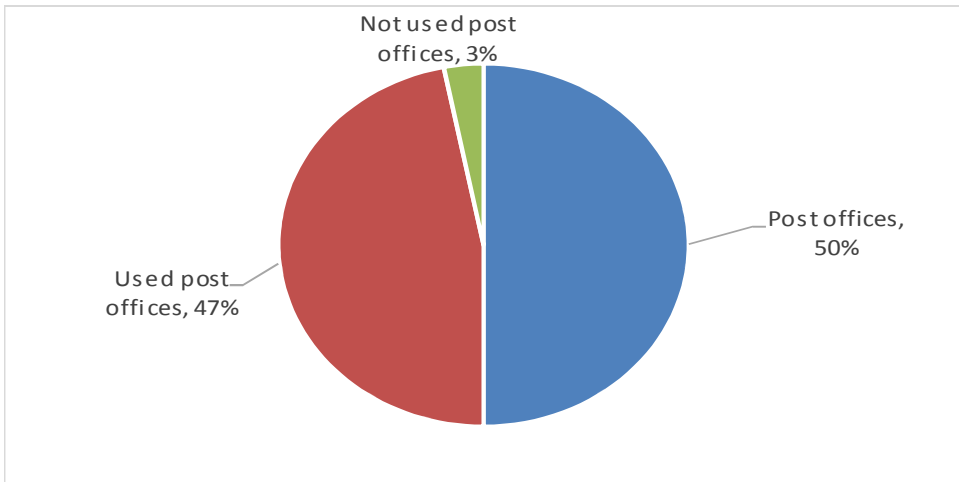

## 14 Prices

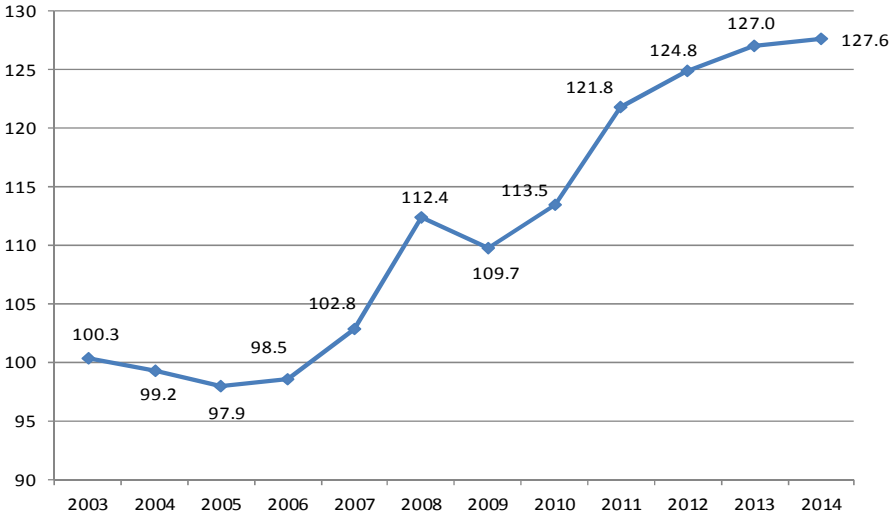

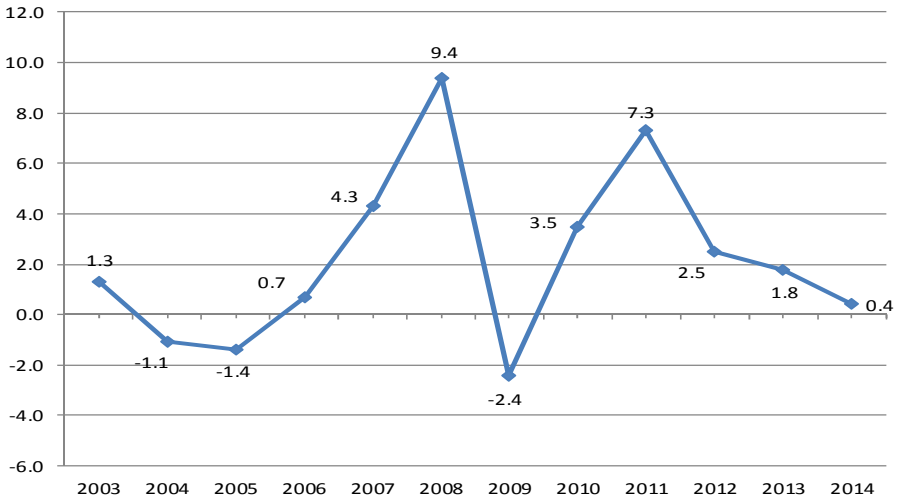

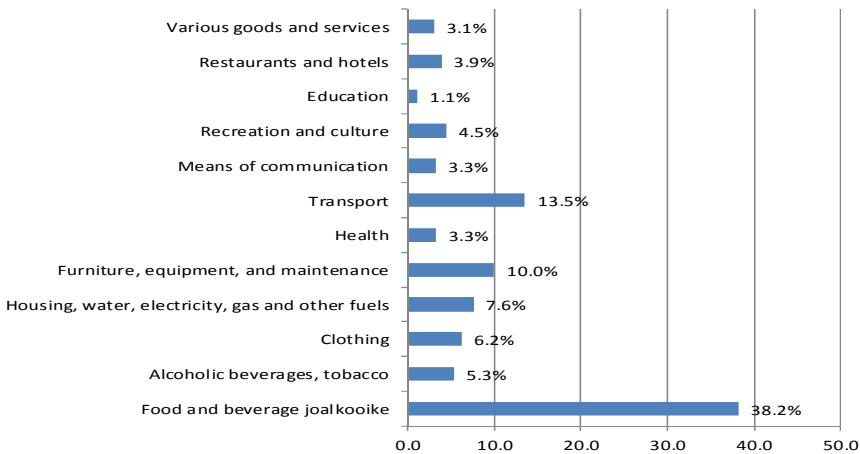

**Graph 24. Graphical presentation of weights according to COICOP groups in percentage for 2013**

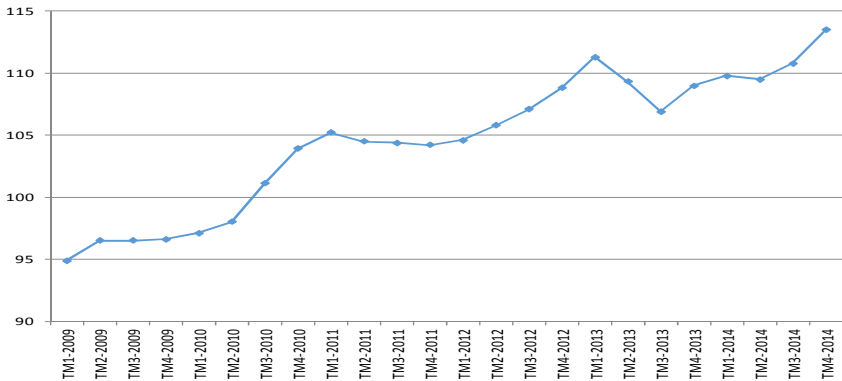

**Graph 25: Development of PPI, first quarter 2008 - fourth quarter 2014 (2007 = 100)**

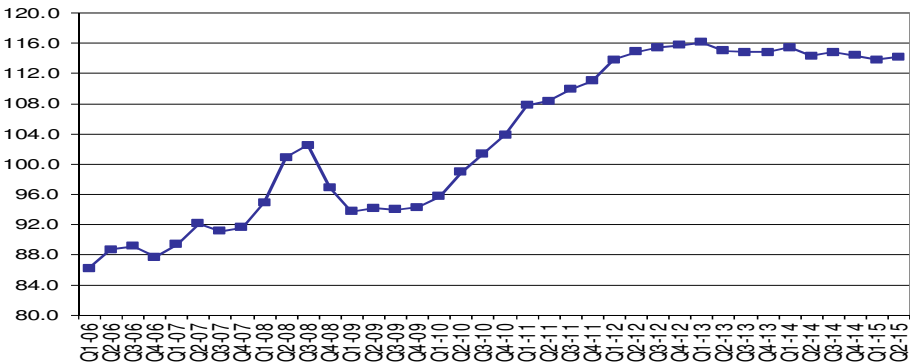

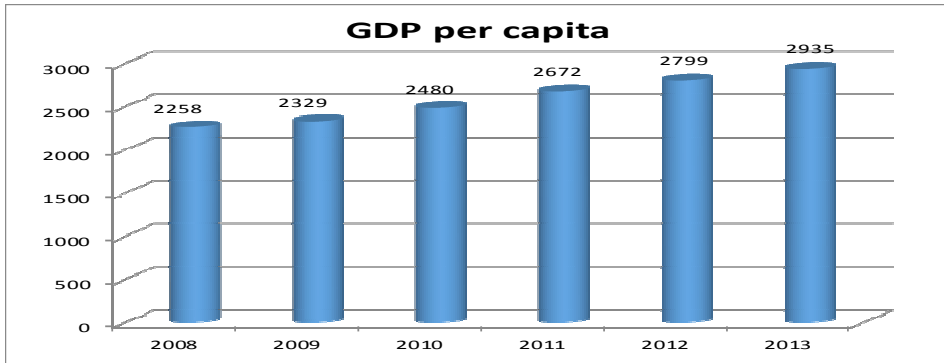
