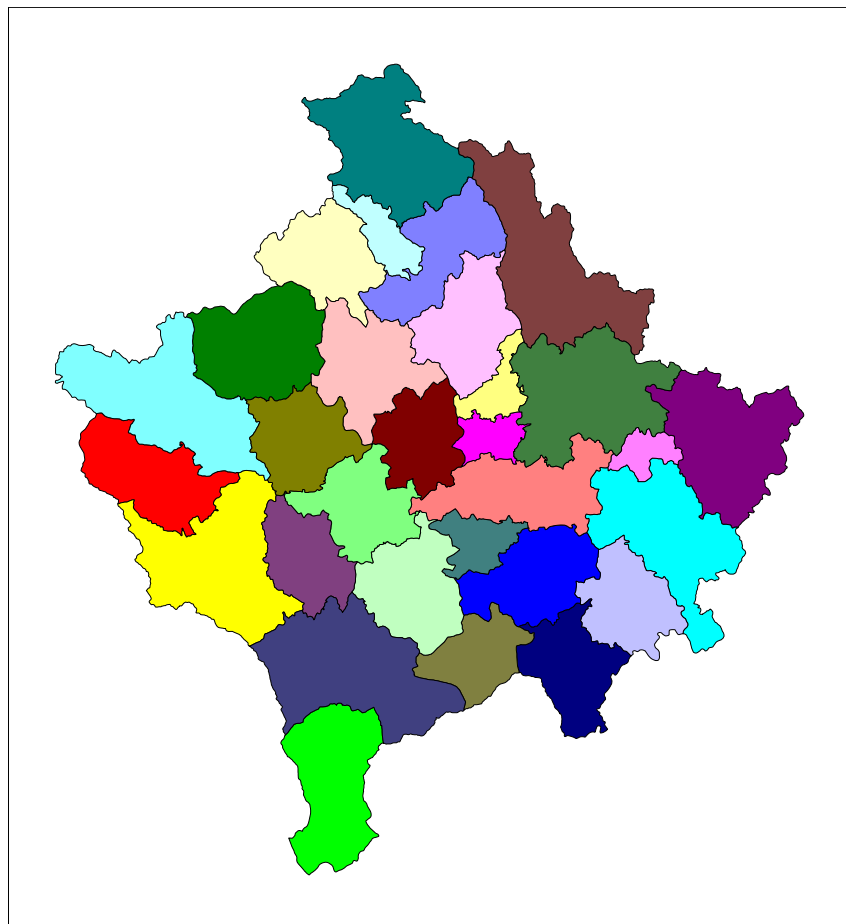

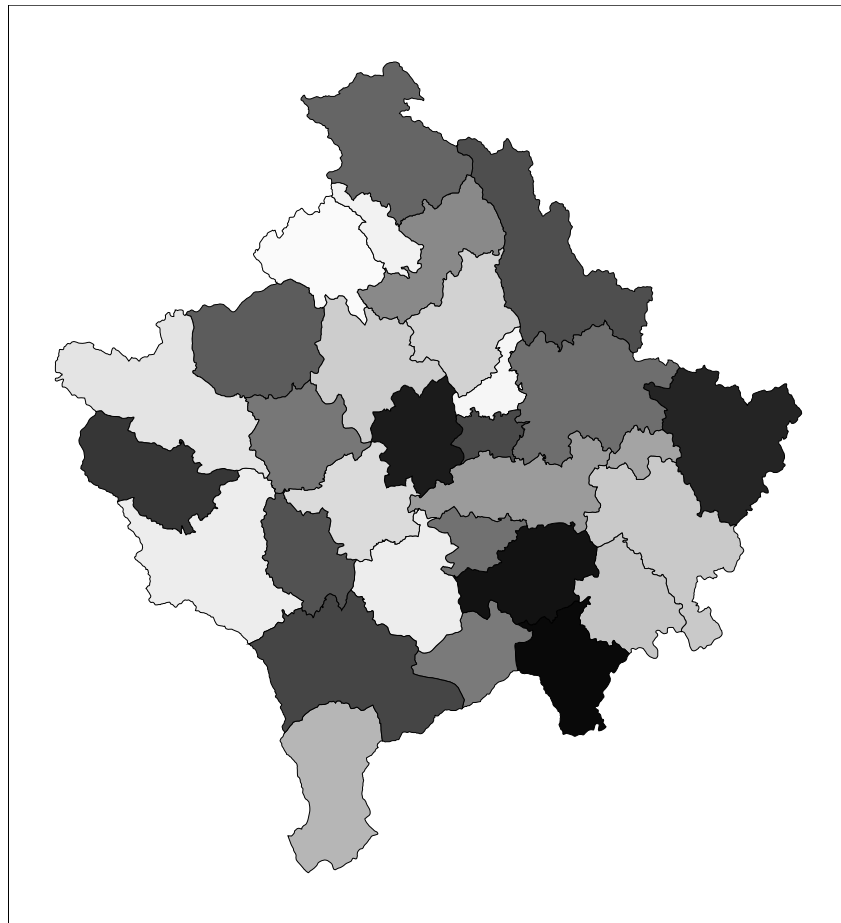

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## Export, Import flow during 2007

By analyzing the data for the period of 2002 - 2007, it can be seen that there is an increase of export and import. Trade deficit in 2007 was 1.411.0 million Euros which reflects a negative balance also in this year. The total of export in 2007 was 165.1 million Euros whilst the import was 1.576.1 million Euros; the export covers the import 10,5% alone.

This publication provides explanations and details on what does our country imports from the external market and what exports for external market (i.e., trade).

Comparing the data of 2007 with 2006 for some main groups of goods, it can be noted that the annual growth (increase) of the export goes for 49,1% high. The main components of the export for 2007 are machinery and transport equipment increasing from 8.9 million euros in 22.6 million euros (153,9%), food and live animals increased from 8.5 million euros into 14.2 million euros (66,7%), other processed goods from 31.8 million euros into 50.6 million euros (59,0%), combustibles from 8.5 million euros in 12.5 million euros (47,3%), beverages and tobaccos from 2.7 million euros in 3.8 million euros (39,6%), crude materials from 42.9 thousand euros in 53.5 thousand euros (24,7%), unprocessed material from 5.5 thousand euros in 6.1 thousand euros (11,1%) and there is a decrease of a group of chemical products from 1.38 million euros into 1.35 million euros (- 2,2%).

Regarding the imports, the annual growth in 2007 was 20,7%. Main components of the imports are: unprocessed materials has gone up from 24.5 million euros in 36.4 million euros (48,5%), unprocessed material from 112.6 million euros in 143.6 million euros (27,5%), machinery and transportation equipment from 232.2 million euros into 294.3 million euro (26,7%), beverages and tobaccos from 73.4 million euros in 91.3 million euros (24,4%), food and live animals from 228.3 million euros in 272.4 million euros (19,3%), combustibles from 217.1 million euros in 258.3 million euros (19,0%), processed goods from 264.8 million euros into 307.6 million euros (16,2%), chemical products increased from 138.7 million euros in 156.4 million euros (12,8%), vegetable and animal fats increased from 13.9 million euros in 15.5 million euros (11,4%).

Regarding the export - import of Kosovo, the main trade partners are Balkan countries participating with 42,5% for export and 43,2% for import in the rapport with the total of the year 2007, while EU participation was 42,0% for export and 36,3% for import in the rapport with the total of the year 2007. Regarding the exports of Kosovo with Balkan countries, Albanian participates with 12,6% Serbia with 11,7%, Macedonia with 10,5% in rapport with the total of the year 2007, and the major participants of the imports in Kosovo from the Balkan countries are Macedonia with 15,1% and Serbia with 14,1%.

## External Trade Statistics – methodological notes

### Sources

The statistics of trade is compiled mainly from the documents supplied by importers and exporters (or their agents) to the Customs authorities. The document is the *Single Administrative Document (SAD)* used for Customs clearance purposes. The information on the document is captured by the Customs Information system. The additional sources of data are administrative data for import and export of electricity.

### Responsibility for data collection, compilation and publication

The Customs Administration is responsible for the collection, inputting and processing of customs declarations data. SAD records with statistical fields are reported monthly to the Statistical Office by the Customs Administration on electronic media.

SOK is responsible for external trade data collection, compilation and publication. Statistics defines the coverage of statistics by kinds of customs procedures. The additional work involves editing and validation of customs data.

### Coverage

External trade statistics does not cover temporary imports and exports of goods which will be returned after a certain period in an unchanged condition, services, repairs, money as means of payment, monetary gold, fuel supply of Kosovo's vehicles abroad, imports of goods for foreign liaisons and other diplomatic missions in Kosovo, personal baggage of travelers, commercial samples and postal packages of minor value.

### Recording system

External trade statistics are compiled in accordance with the 'special' system (**relaxed definition**) of recording international trade. Under this system imports and exports are recorded at the time the goods are moved across the free circulation area, that is, the part within which goods may be disposed of without customs restriction. **Relaxed definition means** inclusion of inward and outward processing beside the regular import and export transactions.

Special imports consist of imports of foreign goods into the free circulation area for consumption, for processing and after outward processing.

Special exports include exports of goods originating in the free circulation area, goods after inward processing and goods for outward processing.

Goods in transit are excluded.

### Valuation

For imports the *cif* value (inclusive of cost, insurance and freight to the point of entry to the Kosovo) is used. For exports the *FOB* (free on board) value is used. This is the cost of goods to the purchaser abroad, including packing, transport in the State, loading charges, insurance and all other charges accruing up to the point where the goods are put on board the exporting vessel or aircraft or are conveyed to the land frontier. The invoice value is recalculated to the value at the Kosovo's border by adding or subtracting on whole or in part costs of transport, loading, unloading and insurance, depending on terms of delivery set down in the contract.

The value excludes:

- any sums receivable by the exporter by way of export refund, drawback, subsidy or other bounty
- any foreign customs duties or freight charges beyond the port or point of exportation.

Valuation is in euro. For transactions in which the value is expressed in a foreign currency, conversion to euro is done using the daily current exchange rate.

## Reference period

The calendar month is the basic period for compiling the data. On the base of customs data the time of recording the imports/exports transactions is the date of submission of the customs declaration or according to some other date valid for the implementation of the customs regulations.

## Units of quantity

The **quantity** of exported and imported goods is shown in net mass if it can be determined considering the nature of the product and in the supplementary unit of measurement when it is prescribed in the customs tariff nomenclature.

Net weight is the usual unit of quantity shown. The weight of containers, cases, jars and packing materials is therefore excluded.

Other units of quantity are used for some commodities, notably live animals, motor vehicles, office machines, domestic appliances, watches and clocks, and clothing (where number is used as the unit of quantity), footwear (where the number of pairs is used), floor coverings (where square metres are used), and beverages (where volume is used).

## Partner country

In this publication, imports are recorded *by country of origin* (as opposed to country of consignment or dispatch). Goods obtained or produced in one country originated in that country. A product, in the production of which two or more countries were concerned, is considered as originating in the country in which the last substantial manufacturing process was done. Packing, repacking, sorting and blending are not regarded as manufacturing processes.

Exports are classified *by country of final destination*. The last country to which the goods are specifically directed on their outward movement from the State is regarded as their final destination. This is not necessarily the country in which the goods will be unshipped or that in which they will be finally consumed.

## Country classification

The classification of countries is the country nomenclature (Geonomenclature) as set out annually in the Official Journal of the European Communities. From January 1999, this follows the United Nations' ISO alpha-2 coding system, in which each country is identified by a two letter code.

## Commodity classification

Statistics are collected using the 8-digit Combined Nomenclature (CN) – the EU's tariff and statistical nomenclature. This nomenclature is managed and updated annually by the Commission in co-operation with the member states. The CN is aligned with the 6-digit Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System (HS) – the nomenclature of the Customs Co-operation Council that is used throughout the world for applying customs tariffs and compiling external trade statistics. The CN contains about 10,400 8-digit subheadings, the first six digits of which correspond to the HS code.

The Standard International Trade Classification, Revision 3 (SITC Rev 3) has been developed by the United Nations for the advancement of the international comparability of statistics on external trade.

SITC Rev 3 contains about 3,100 basic headings (5-digit). These are combined into 261 Groups (3-digit), 98 Divisions (2-digit) and 10 Sections (1-digit). For example, Section 6 (Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material) consists of 9 Divisions, 61 to 69. Division 64 (Paper, paperboard and articles thereof) consists of two groups, 641 and 642, which together consist of 72 basic headings, such as 642.94 (Paper handkerchiefs, towels, tablecloths, garments etc).

SITC Rev 3 follows the structure of the HS. Each of the categories in the SITC (including all the basic headings) is equivalent to a combination of HS headings (and therefore to a combination of CN headings)

## Import and export price indices

Import and export price indices are calculated on the basis of customs declaration's data. Monthly unit values and weights at the 8 digits level of Combined Nomenclature are used. Data refining is done to eliminate extreme unit values and small transactions. Elementary

indices are aggregated to derive overall index, weighted by monthly shares of chapters' imports/exports out of total. The Fisher formula type is applied. The annual Unit value index is weighted average of the monthly index numbers.

### **Publication of data**

**Monthly data** are **provisional** until the release of final data; these data are published 45 days after the reference month.

**Annual data** are published twice: first time as provisional data within the regular time delay (45 days after the reference month), and the second time as final data (in May, the previous year).

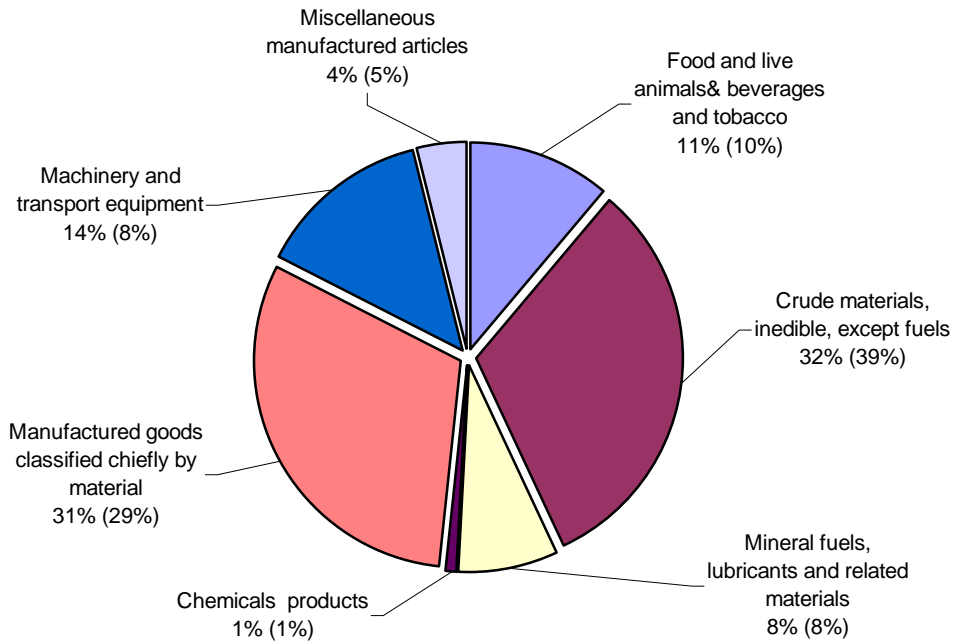

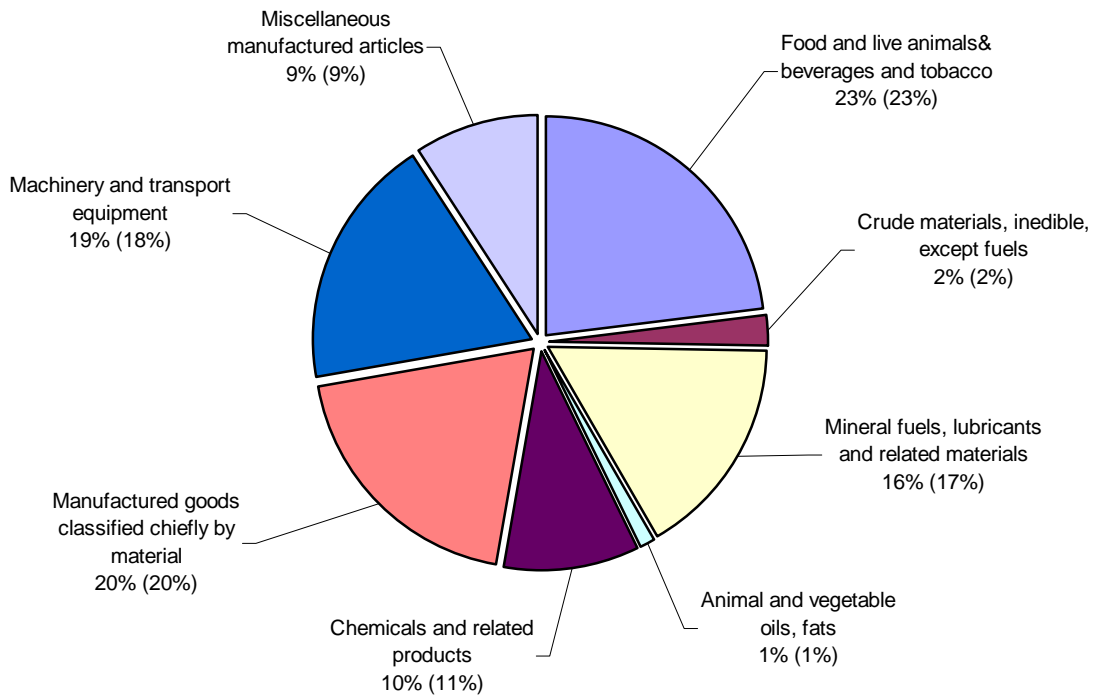

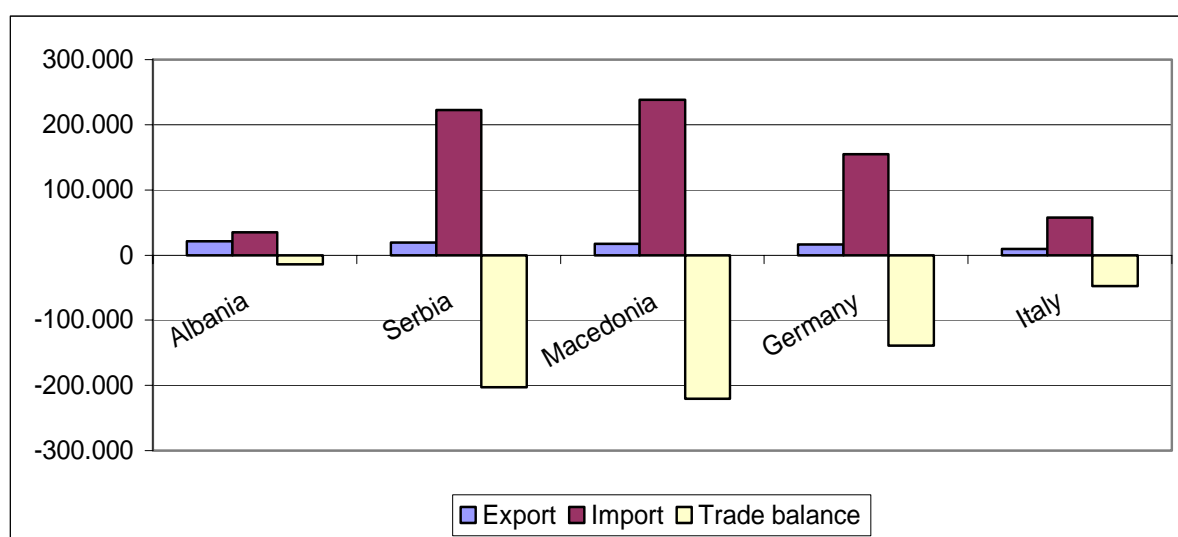

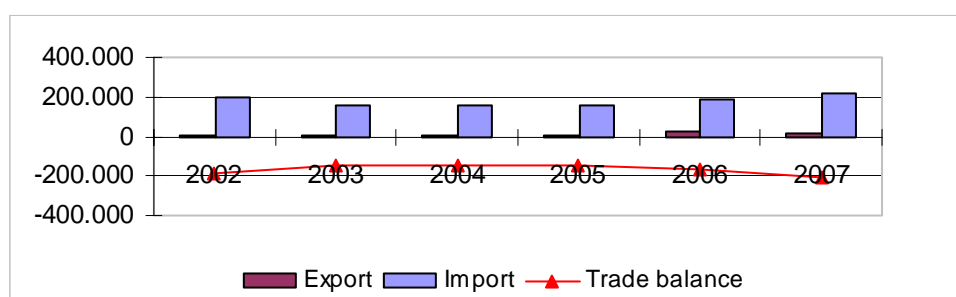

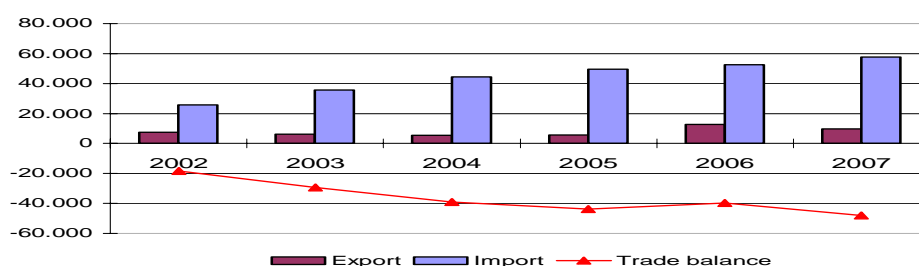

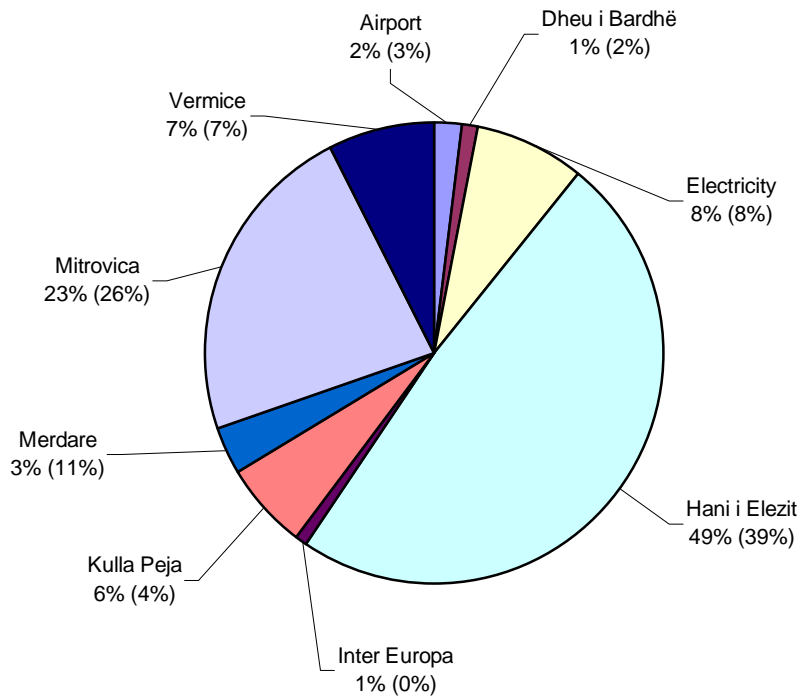

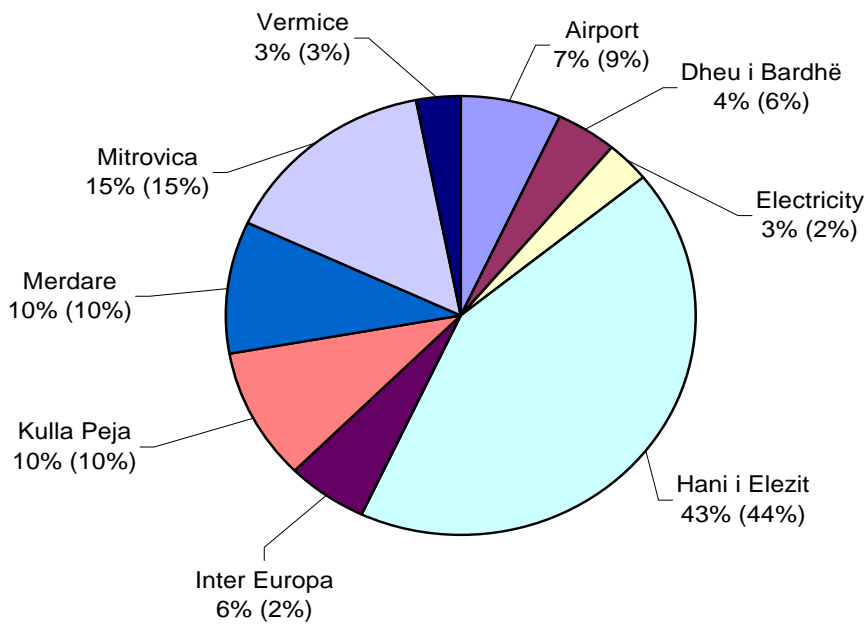

## Statistical Office of Kosovo, a brief description

**The Statistical Office of Kosovo (SOK)** is a professional office operating since 1948. The SOK passed through some of the historic phases and it has been structured by the state rule of that time. SOK restarted its work on August 2, 1999, as an independent and professional office working in the frames of the Ministry of Public Services (MPS). SOK is financed by the Kosovo Consolidated Budget and by donors for the various projects.

**The Statistical Office of Kosovo** acts pursuant the UNMIK Regulation 2001/14 that entered into force on July 2, 2001. A medium-term Master Plan is being developed for the statistical system of Kosovo compatible with the European Statistics.

**The SOK Organization Structure;** composes of four departments for production of statistics (Department of Economic Statistics and National Accounts, Department of Population Statistics, Department of Social Statistics and Department of Agricultural and Environment Statistics), seven Regional Offices (located in Gjakova, Gjilan, Mitrovica, Peja, Prizren, Pristina and Ferizaj), two support departments (Department of Methodology and Information Technology, and Department of Administration), as well as the Office of the Population Census.

Total number employees is 134, of them 96 (71.6%) within the SOK offices whilst 38 (28.4%) in regional offices.

There is also a support and cooperation with the international institutions.

The Statistical Office of Kosovo covers Kosovo entirely. For implementation of the surveys in the field, the SOK uses appropriate sampling and methodology approach. In the collection of the reports from the reporting units, the SOK engages professionals, technicians, administrators and civilians form the local offices and regional field population census.

Recently, a team of national and international experts is working in the project of the population census.

**SOK Mission** is to fulfill the needs of the users with the reliable statistical data and with regular analyses in order to support and provide government departments with the proper information for decision-making process including other users as well.

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
