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## Foreword

Kosovo Agency of Statistics (KAS) started to publish data on the imports for Kosovo since 2002.

Publication of external trade is based on data from Kosovo Customs Service and Kosovo Energy Corporation for electricity.

The data in this publication are different from the preliminary data published for 2014.

This annual publication contains 23 tables for External Trade of Kosovo with some comparisons for the years 2013- 2014. These tables deal with imports and exports according to the flow of goods, sections, countries and items.

Imports are presented by country of origin of goods.

Compared with previous publications, in this publication are added some new tables which present our country's trade exchange with key partners.

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## Flows of export and import in 2014

The trade deficit in 2014 amounted to 2,213,7 million euros and this year too presents a negative balance. Total exports in the year was 324.5 million, while imports 2,538,3 million euros. Exports covered imports to only 12.8%.

In this publication are given many wide detailed explanations about what our country imports from the external market and what exports to the external market.

By comparing the export data for 2014 with those of 2013, exports of goods increased about (10.4%). The main components of export in 2014 were: chemical products about (25.9%), food and live animals around (22.9%), processed goods (18.9%), machinery and transport equipment (17.3%), raw material about (5.1%), other processed goods about (0.6%), and there was a decrease in these commodity groups: animal and vegetable fats around (-56.5%), fuels about (-24.2%), beverages and tobacco around (- 6.6%).

Concerning the export and import of Kosovo, the main trade partners are EU countries with the participation of about 30.2% for export and about 42.6% for import, as well as CEFTA countries participating with 39.2% for exports and 28.4% for import in relation with the total in 2014.

Regarding the exports of Kosovo with Balkan countries, Albania participates with 13.6%, 11.1% Macedonia, Serbia with 8.4%, Montenegro 5.0%, in relation to the total in 2014, while biggest participation in Kosovo imports from Balkan countries has Serbia with 14.5%, Macedonia with 5.5% and Albania with 5.3%.



## **External trade statistics - methodological notes**

### **Resources**

Trade statistics compile mainly from the documents submitted to the Customs authorities by importers and exporters (or their agents). This document is Single Custom Document (SCD), which is used for customs clearance purposes. The information document is captured by the Customs Information System. The additional source of data is the administrative data for import and export of electricity.

### **Responsibility for the collection, compilation and publication of data**

The customs administration is responsible for the collection, inputting and processing of the data from customs statements. The data in the field of statistics are registered in SCD, are reported on a monthly basis by the Customs Administration in KAS via electronically.

KAS is responsible for processing, compilation and publication of external trade data. These statistics include data by the type of customs procedures. Additional work involves editing and validation (approving) of the customs data.

### **Inclusion**

External trade statistics do not include imports and exports of goods which are temporary unaltered and will return after a certain period, such as services, repairs, money as means of payment, money in gold, fuel supply of Kosovo's vehicles abroad, imports of goods for foreign liaisons offices and other diplomatic missions in Kosovo, travelers personal baggage, commercial samples and postal packages of minor value.

### **Recording system**

External trade statistics are compiled according to the "special" system (facilitating definition) of recording of international trade. Under this system, imports and exports are recorded at the time when goods move across the territory free of movement of this is the part when goods may be sold without any customs restrictions. The facilitating definition means that beside regular transaction of import and export, external and internal processing is included.

Special imports include imports of external goods into the free flow area for consumption, for processing and then to external processing.

Special exports include exports of goods headed in the free circulation area, goods for internal processing and goods for external processing.  
Excluded are goods that are in transit.

### **Valuation**

For imports, the value used is c.i.f. (cost, insurance and freight to the point of entry in Kosovo). For exports value is used f.o.b. (free on board). This is the price of goods purchased abroad, including packing, transport within the state, loading charges, insurance and other costs that arise when goods are put on board for exporting in vessel, aircraft or transferred to remote/far areas. The invoice value is recalculated to the value of the Kosovo border by adding or subtracting the whole or in part the costs of transport, loading, unloading, depending on the terms of delivery by the contract.

The value excludes:

- any sum receivable by the exporter during the way of refund, drawback, subsidy or other relief.
- any external customs duties or transport freight charge except in the customs point or at the export point.

Valuation is in euro. For transactions where the value is expressed in a foreign currency, conversion to euro is done using the weekly exchange.

### **Reference period**

The calendar month is the basic period for collection of the data. Based on customs data, the date of submission of the customs declaration or other date valid for the implementation of customs regulations, are the time to record the transactions of import/export.

### **Units of quantity**

The quantity of exported and imported goods is shown in net weight (mass) if it can be determined, taking into account the nature of the product and in the supplementary units as described by the customs tariff nomenclature.

Net weight is the usual unit of quantity shown. The weight of containers, cases, jars and packing materials are excluded.

Other units of quantity are used for some commodities, notably live animals, motor vehicles, domestic appliances, watches, clothes (number is used as the unit), footwear (the number of pairs is used), floor coverings (the square meter is used), and beverages (the volume is used).

### **Partner countries**

In this publication, imports are recorded by country of origin (as opposed to country of destination). Goods obtained or produced in one country originating from the same country. A product in the production of which are included two or more countries, as country of origin is considered the place where the last processing has become important. Packing, repacking, and sorting are not regarded as manufacturing processes.

Exports are classified by country of final destination. The final destination of the goods is considered the last country to which the goods are destined. This does not mean that this is the country where the goods will be unloaded or where they will be consumed.

## **Classification of country**

Nomenclature of countries is the classification of the states (Geo-nomenclature), according to the Official Gazette of the European Commission published annually. Since January 1999, the ISO alpha-2 coding system of the United Nations is used, where each country is identified by a two letter code.

## **Classification of goods**

Statistics are collected by using the Combined Nomenclature (CN) 8 digit - tariff and statistical nomenclature of the EU. This nomenclature is managed and updated annually by the Commission in cooperation with Member States. CN is aligned with the 6-digit system of the Harmonized System of Commodity Description and Coding System (HS) - the Nomenclature of the Customs Council for Co-operation that is used throughout the world for applying customs tariffs and compiling external trade statistics. The CN contains about 10,400 sub-head 8-digit number, the first six digits are identical with the figures of the Harmonized System (HS).

The Standard Classification of Trade (SCT), revision No.3 (ITC Rev 3) has been developed by the United Nations for advanced international comparability of external trade statistics.

Standard Classification of External Trade (SCET) Revision No.3 contains about 3,100 basic headings (5-digit). These are combined into 261 groups (3-digit), 98 divisions (2-digit) and 10 sections (1-digit). For example, Section 6 (manufactured goods classified mainly by material) consists of 9 Divisions, 61 to 69. Division 64 (paper, paperboard and articles thereof) consists of two groups, 641 and 642, which together consist of 72 basic headings, such as 642.94 (paper handkerchiefs, towels, tablecloths, and the like).

SCET Revision No.3 is identical to the structure of the HS. Each of the categories in the SCET (including all the basic headings) is equivalent to a combination of HS headings (and therefore to a combination of CN headings).

## **Publication of data**

Monthly data are provisional until they are released as final data and published 30 days after the reference month.

Annual data are published twice: firstly as provisional data within the regular deadline (40 days after the reference period) and secondly as final data (in June).

IMPORT AND EXPORT IN KOSOVO BY COUNTRY (value in%)

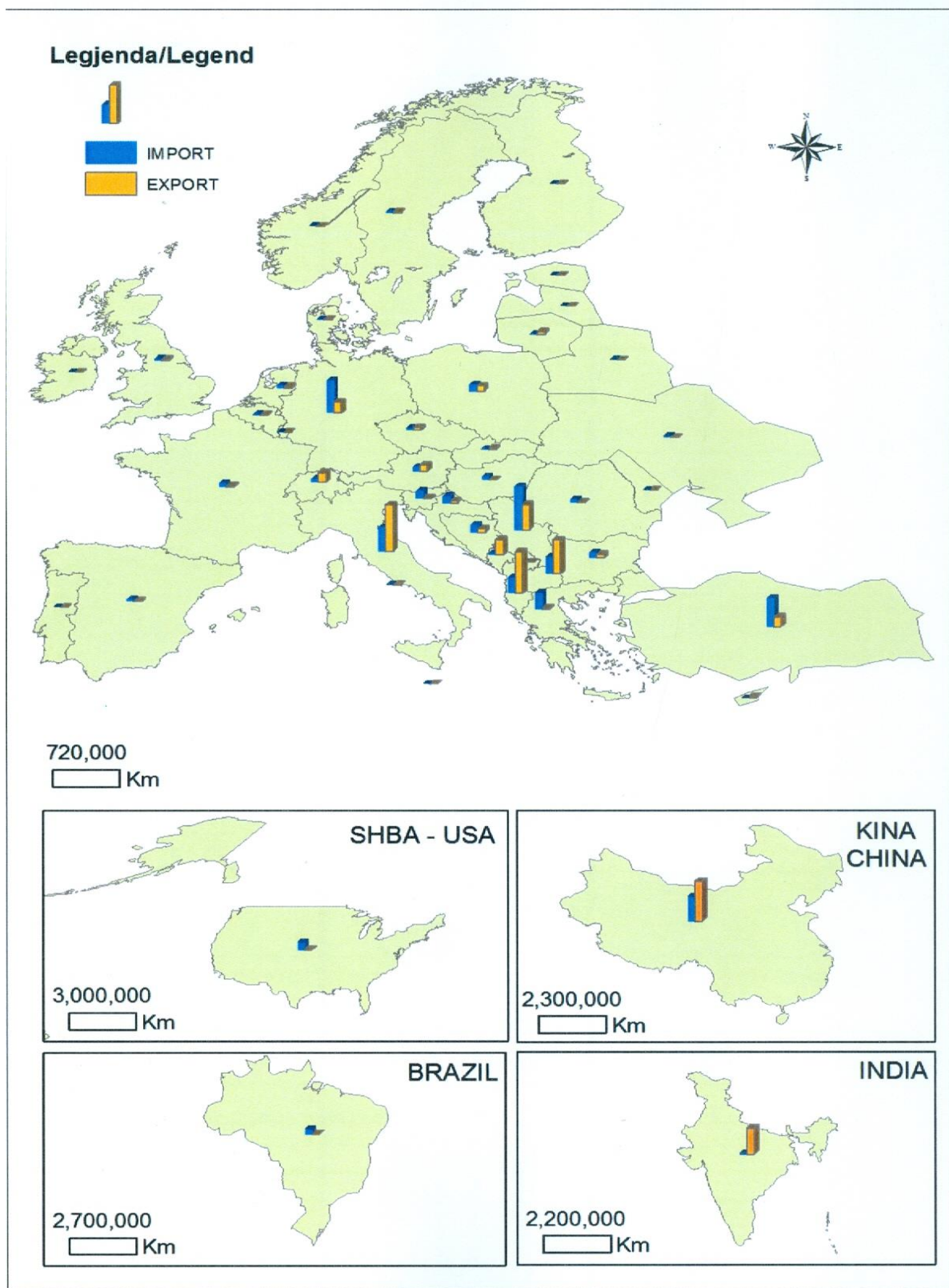

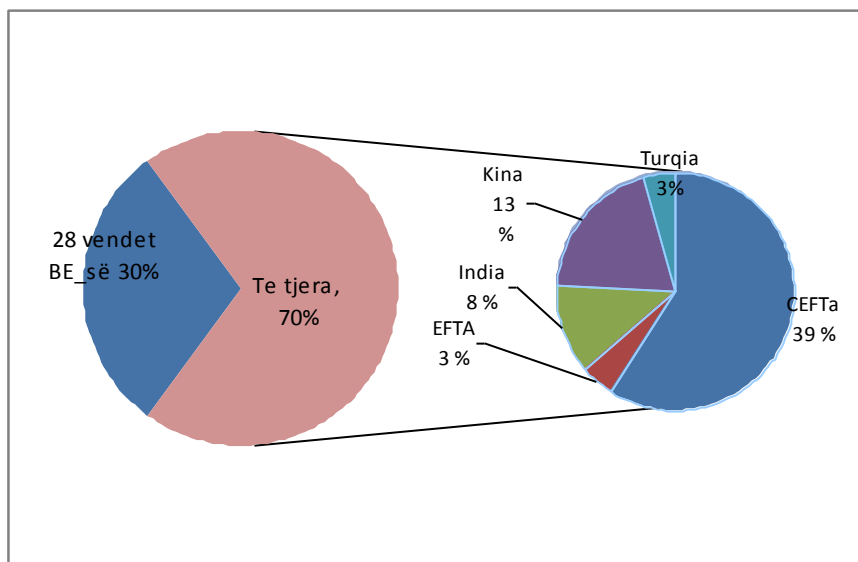

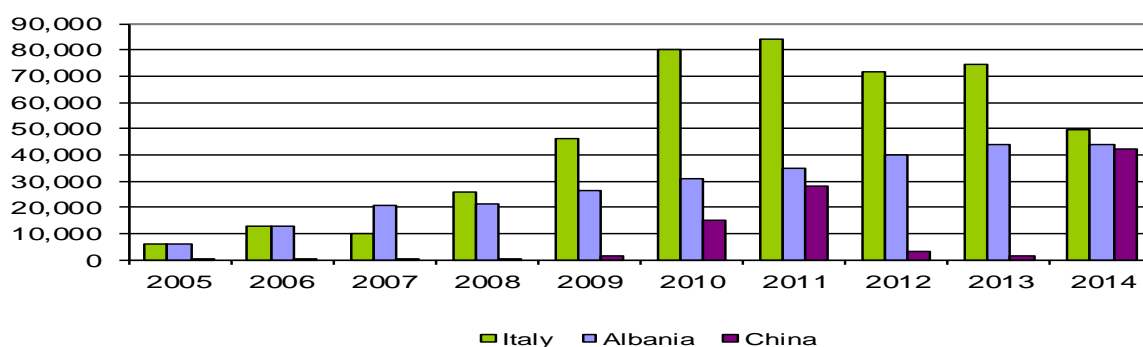
**Graph 4: The main export partners of Kosovo in 2014**

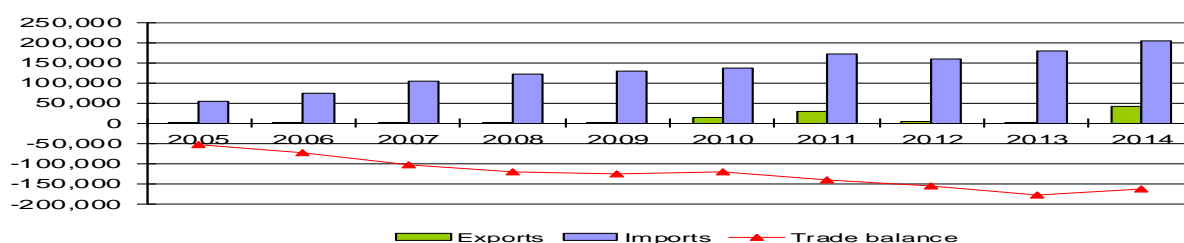

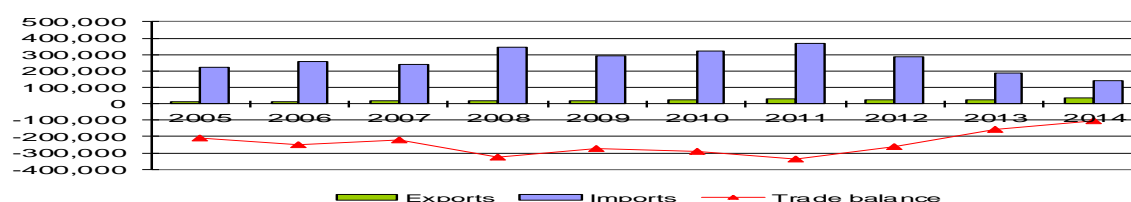

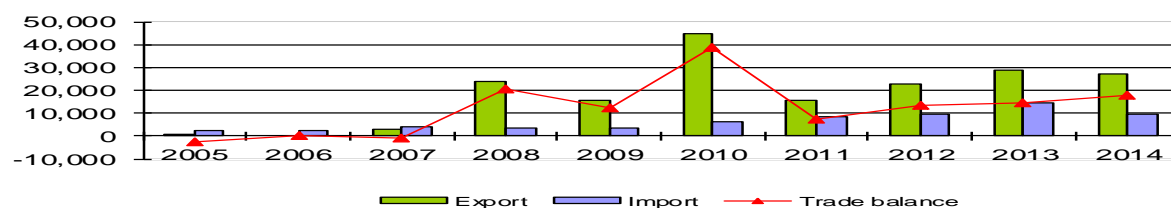

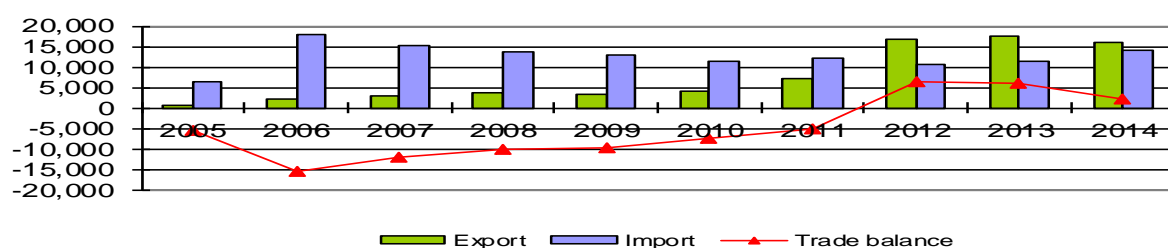

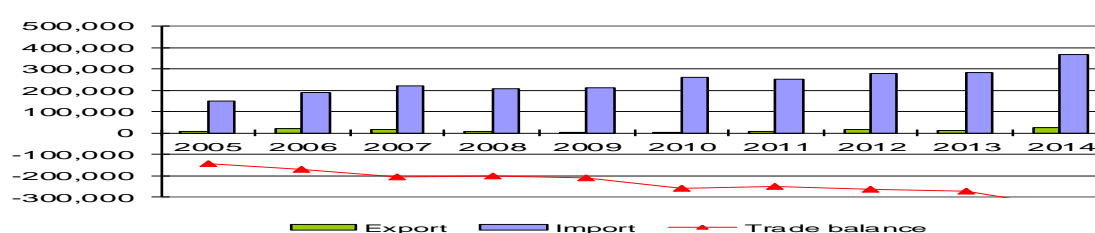

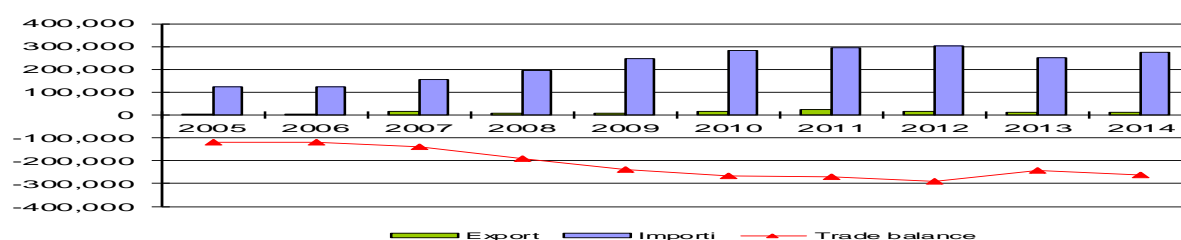

# Kosovo Agency of Statistics

## *short description*

**Kosovo Agency of Statistics** is a professional institution which deals with collection, processing and publication of official statistical data. As such acts since 1948 and has passed through several historical stages, structured according to state regulation of those times.

On 2 August 1999, the Agency has resumed his professional work (after nine years of interruption of all statistical series detrimental to the interest of Kosovo), as an independent institution under the Ministry of Public Administration. Since 12.12.2011 the Agency operates in the frames of the Prime Minister's Office. Office is funded by the Kosovo Consolidated Budget, but also by donors for specific projects and for technical professional support.

**Kosovo Agency of Statistics** acts according to the Law No. 04/L-036 which entered into force on 12.12.2011. Strategic development plan 2009-2013 is the middle term implementation for the development of statistical system in correlation with the European Union statistics (EUROSTAT).

**Kosovo Agency of Statistics** has this organizational structure: production departments; (Department of Economic statistics and National Accounts, Department of Agriculture and Environment statistics and Department of Social statistics. **Support Departments;** Department of Methodology and Information Technology, Department of Policy Planning, Coordination and Communication, Department of Census and survey and Department of Administration. **Within the Agency we also established. Regional Offices;** Gjakove, Gjilan, Mitrovica, Peja, Prizren, Pristina and Ferizaj

In ASK are employed in total 139 workers, of them 104 (74,8 %) at the headquarters of the Agency, while in the Regional Offices, 35 (25,2%), with qualifying structure, 70,5% with university education to 29,5% with secondary education.

We have professional and technical cooperation with all Ministries of the Government of Kosovo, especially with the Ministry of Economy and Finance, Central Bank of Kosovo, with international institutions, EUROSTAT, International Monetary Fund, World Bank, Sweden's SIDA, DFID, UNFPA, UNDP, UNVEF, and with the statistical institutions of the countries in the region.

**Kosovo Agency of Statistics** almost completely covers the territory of Kosovo, based on the statistical structure of the enumeration areas as the basic unit and sole in the country from which it gets first hand information. All surveys conducted in the field use the extension of the samples in these enumeration areas but also a statistical methodology according to international recommendations. During the collection of statistical data and reports from reporting entities are involved professionals, technicians, administrators, servants of the country offices, field enumerators from regional offices, etc.

We have successfully implemented the project of Population Census, Households and Dwellings in 2011, Census that was not carried out since 1981. Results obtained from the Census will have an important role in compiling the development policies.

**The mission of the Agency;** to meet the needs of users with qualitative statistical data, objective, in time and space so that users have reliable base to conduct regular analysis in the interest of planning and project development at the municipal and country level. To support government institutions, scientific institutes, research academies, businesses in order to provide proper information for decision-makers and other users in Kosovo.

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
