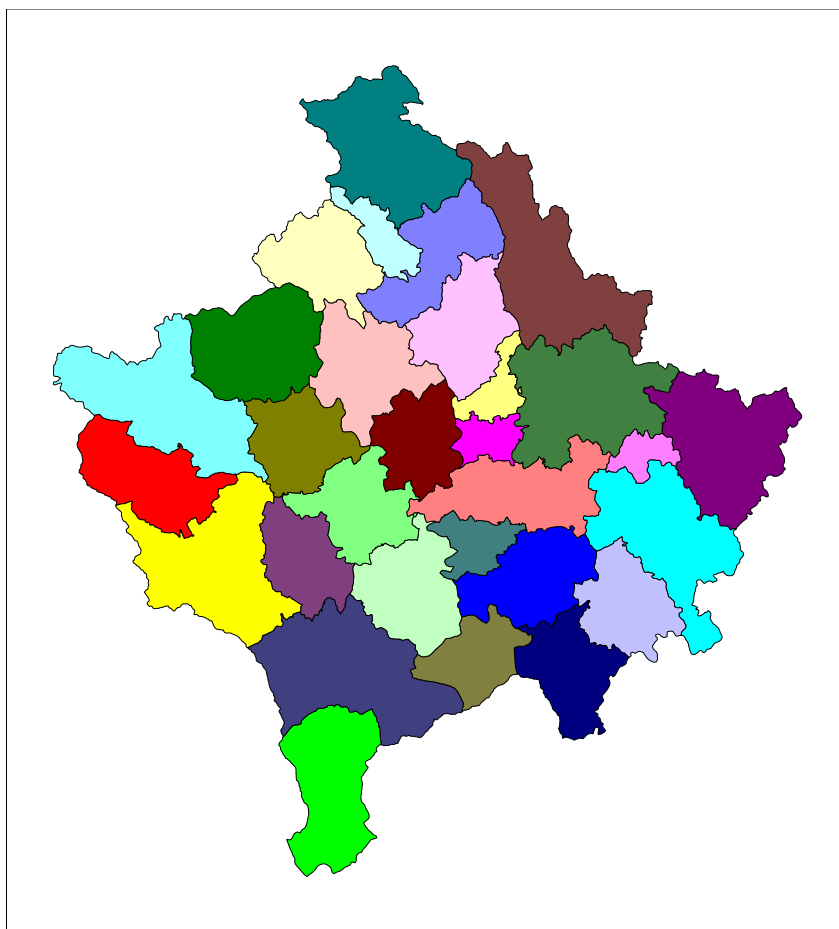

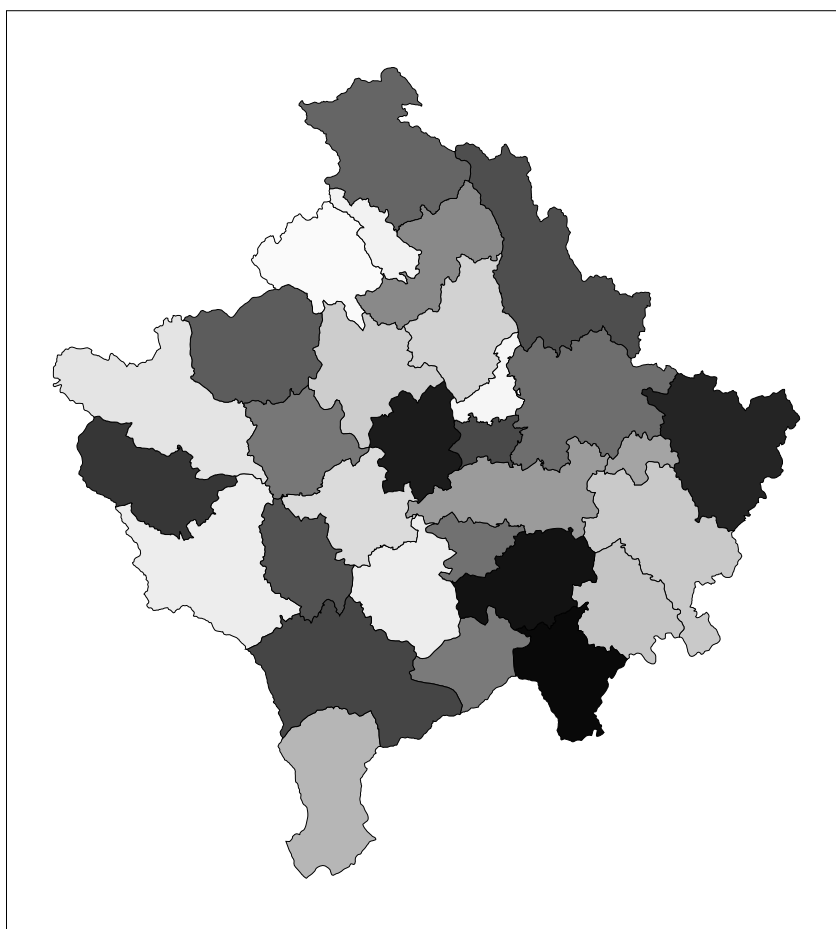

F o r e w o r d

The Statistical Office of Kosovo (SOK) started to publish the data for the Import of Kosovo since 2001.

Publication of External Trade is based on the data provided by the Kosovo Customs Service and Kosovo Electric Corporation on electricity.

First preliminary data on Export are of years 2000 and 2001.

Data in this publication differs from the preliminary data published previously.

This annual publication composes of 19 tables for External Trade of Kosovo for 2006 with some comparisons with years 2002 - 2006. Tables are in regard of export and import according to the flow of goods, sections, countries, border points and articles.

Imports are presented according to the origin of the country.

Suggestions and remarks are welcomed.

Future publications will probably bring new data and a better quality.

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Export, Import flow during 2006

Analyzing the data for the period of 2002 - 2006, it can be notified that there is a growth (increase) of export and import.

Trade deficit in 2006 was 1195.1 million Euros which reflects a negative balance also in this year. The total of export in 2006 was 110.7 million Euros whilst the import was 1305.8 million Euros; the export covers the import 8.5% alone.

This publication gives more explanations and details on what does our country imports from the external market and what exports for external market (trade).

Comparing the data of 2006 with 2005 for some main groups of goods, it can be seen that the annual increase of the export goes for 96.8% higher. The main components of the export for 2006 are mineral fuels increasing from 1.7 million euros in 8.5 million euros (396.1%), processed goods increased from 6.6 million euros into 31.8 million euros (377.5%), other processed goods from 2.8 million euros into 5.5 million euros (92.1%), vegetable and animal fats from 143 thousand euros into 247 thousand euros (73.0%), food and live animals increased from 5.0 million euros into 8.5 million euros (68.0%), unprocessed material increased from 26.8 million euros into 42.9 million euros (59.8%).

Regarding the imports, the annual increase in 2006 has been 12.8%. Main components of the imports are vegetable and animal fats; the increase has gone up from 9.9 million euros into 13.9 million euros (40.4%), processed goods from 220.1 million euros into 264.8 million euros (20.3%), chemical products increased from 115.9 million euros in 138.7 million euros (19.7%), mineral fuels from 182.3 million euros in 217.1 million euros (19.0%), other processed goods from 99.4 million euros in 112.6 million euros (13.3%), food and live animals from 206.1 million euros in 228.3 million euros (10.7%), beverages and tobaccos from 65.6 million euros in 73.4 million euros (11.8%), unprocessed materials from 23.4 million euros in 24.5 million euros (4.4%), and there is a decrease of a group of goods in machinery and transportation equipment from 234.2 million euros into 232.2 million euro (-0,9%).

Regarding the export - import of Kosovo, the main trade partners are Balkan countries participating with 60.4% for export and 53% for import in the rapport with the total of the year 2006, while EU participation has been with 25.8% for export and 30.0% for import in the rapport with the total of the year 2006. Regarding the exports of Kosovo with Balkan countries, Serbia participates with 18.9% in rapport with the total of the year 2006, Bulgaria with 12.2%, Albanian with 11.4%, and the major participants of the imports in Kosovo from the Balkan countries are Macedonia with 19.7% and Serbia with 14.6%.

External Trade Statistics – methodological notes

Resources

Statistics of the trade compound mainly from the delivered documentation to the customs authority by importers or exporters (or their agents). This document is called Customs Unique Document (CUD) and is used for customs clearance purposes. Information's from these documents are kept by the customs informational system. Additional resources of the data are administrative data for import and export of the electricity.

Data collection, compiling and publication responsibilities

Custom administration is responsible for collection, data base entry and for processing of the data from the customs statements. Data on the field of the statistics registered in the CUD are reported on monthly bases from the Customs Administration to the SOK electronically. The SOK is responsible for collecting, compiling and publication of the data of the external trade. These statistics include data by the type of customs procedures. Additional work includes correcting and approving the customs data.

Scope of the work

Statistics of the external trade do not include imports and exports of the temporary goods that are returned after a certain time in unchanged status, as are: services, repairmen's, money from the salaries, money in gold, furnishing the Kosovar vehicles abroad with fuel, import of the goods for liaison offices and other diplomatic missions in Kosovo, personal luggage of travelers, commercial examples or postal packages of low value.

Registration system

Statistics of external trade are compiled according to the "special" system (facilitating definition) of the registration of the international trade. According to this system, imports and exports are registered during the time when goods are moving in the territory on a free flow, and this is the part when the goods can be sold without any costumes restriction. Facilitating definition means that beside the regular transaction of the import and export, it also includes external and internal processing.

Special imports compound of import of the goods from abroad, from within the territory with free on flow for consuming, goods for internal and external processing.

Special imports include exports of goods headed for countries with free on flow, goods for internal processing and goods for external processing; not included are goods in transit.

Evaluation

For imports, it is used the value c.i.f. (including the cost, insurance and transportation of goods in border/entering points in Kosovo). For exports, it is used the value f.o.b. (free on board). This is the price of goods bought abroad, including the packaging, transportation within the state, cost for shipment (loading), insurance, as well as other expenditures occurred when the goods are placed in the ship for exportation, in the airplane, or are carried in the distant zones. The value of the receipt is re-estimated in the value of the Kosovar border, by adding or subtracting, totally or partially, cost of transportation, of loading or unloading, that depend from the conditions for furnishing, as contracted.

The value does not include:

- Any amount accepted by the exporter during the process of refunding, returning of the customs payment, subvention or any other support.
- Any foreign customs obligation or exchange of the transportation of the goods except in the customs or export point.

The value is in Euro. Regarding the transactions when the value is given in another foreign currency, the exchange in Euros is applied by using weekly rate of currency exchange.

Referring period

The calendar month is a basic period to collect the data. Based on the customs data, the date of delivery of the customs statement or other dates valuable to implement the customs rules, are also the dates (or time) to register the import/export transactions.

Units of quantity

The quantity of the imported and exported goods are shown in net weight, when possible, by considering the nature of the product, as well as in additional unit when described by the nomenclature of the customs schedule (tariff).

The net weight is an ordinary unit of the given quantity. The weight of containers, luggage, jars and packaging materials is not included.

Other units of the quantity are used for some more important goods, as are: live animals, vehicle running motors, national equipment, watches, clothes (where the number is used as a measurement unit), shoes (where the number of pairs is used), floor coverings (when the meter square is used) and beverages (where the capacity/volume is used).

Partner states

In this publication, imports are registered according to the country of origin (opposite to the country of destination); goods gained or produced in a country of the same origin. In a certain product, where two or more countries are involved, the country of origin is considered to be the country where the final and important processing has been commenced. Packaging, re-packaging, classification, are not considered as product processing's.

Exports are classified according to the country of the final destination. Final destination of the goods is considered to be the last state the goods are dedicated. This does not mean that here the final state is the state where the goods are going to be unloaded or where the last consumption is going to take place.

Classification by states

The nomenclature (structure) of the states is the classification of the states (geonomenclature) according to the Official Gazette of the European Committee, published annually. Since January 1999, the UN system ISO alpha 2 figures are used, where each state is identified with the figure (numeral) composed of two letters.

Classification by goods

Statistics are collected by using the Combined Nomenclature (CN) 8 figures – tariffs and statistical nomenclature of the EU. This nomenclature is leaded and updated is every year from the EU commission in cooperation with the member states. CN is in accordance with the 8-figures system of the Harmonized System of the Description and Code of the Goods (HS) – Nomenclature of the Customs Council for Cooperation used in the world to apply the customs schedules and to compile the statistics of the external trade. CN contains about

10.400 8-figures under-articles, 6 first-figures are the same with the figures of the Harmonized System (HS).

Standard Classification of the Trade (SCT), re-worked version No. 3 (ITC Rev 3), has been developed by the UN for the advanced international compatibility of foreign trade statistics.

International Classification of External Trade (ICET), re-worked version No. 3, contains around 3.100 basic articles (5-figures). These are combined in 261 groups (3-figures), 67 divisions (2-figures) and 10 sections (1-figure). For example, Section 6 (goods manufactured mainly by material) composes of 9 divisions, 61 up to 69. Division 64 (paper, paperboard and other production with related articles) composes of two groups, 641 and 642, that altogether composes of 72 basic articles, as are 642.94 (tissues, towels, table coverings and similar).

ICET re-worked version No. 3, is identical with the structure of the Harmonized System. Each category of ICET (including all basic articles) is equivalent with the combination of the articles of the HS (including the combination of the articles of CN).

Data publication

Monthly data are temporary until are finalized and then are published 30 days after the referring month.

Annual data are published twice: firstly, as temporary data within the preliminary deadline (30 days after referring month) and secondly, as final data (on April).

Graphic 1: Flow on external trade by years

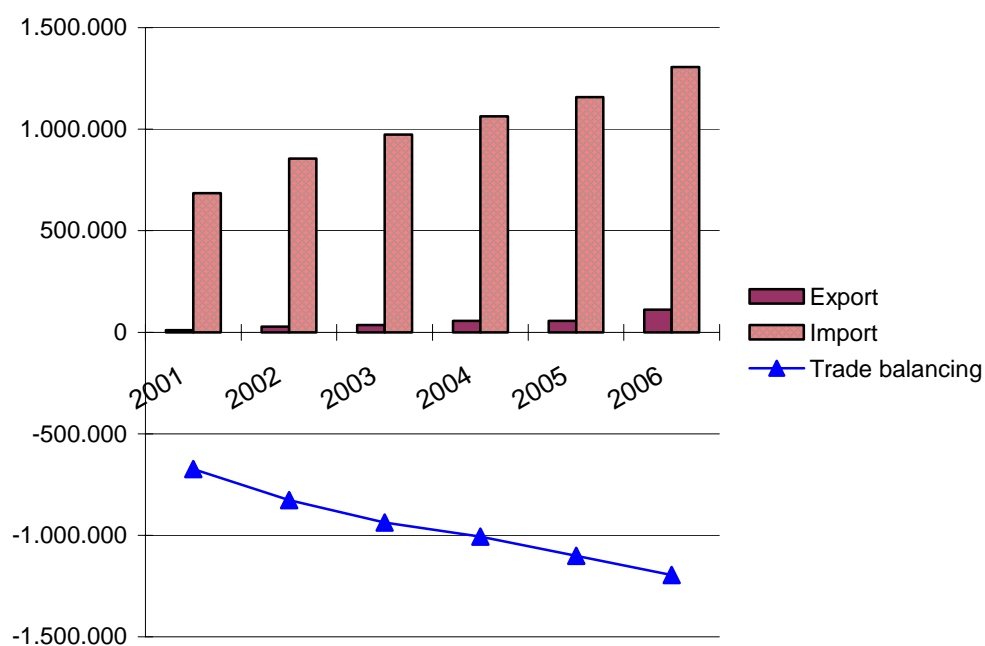

Graphic 2: Flow of goods of external trade by quarter-months (2005 – 2006)

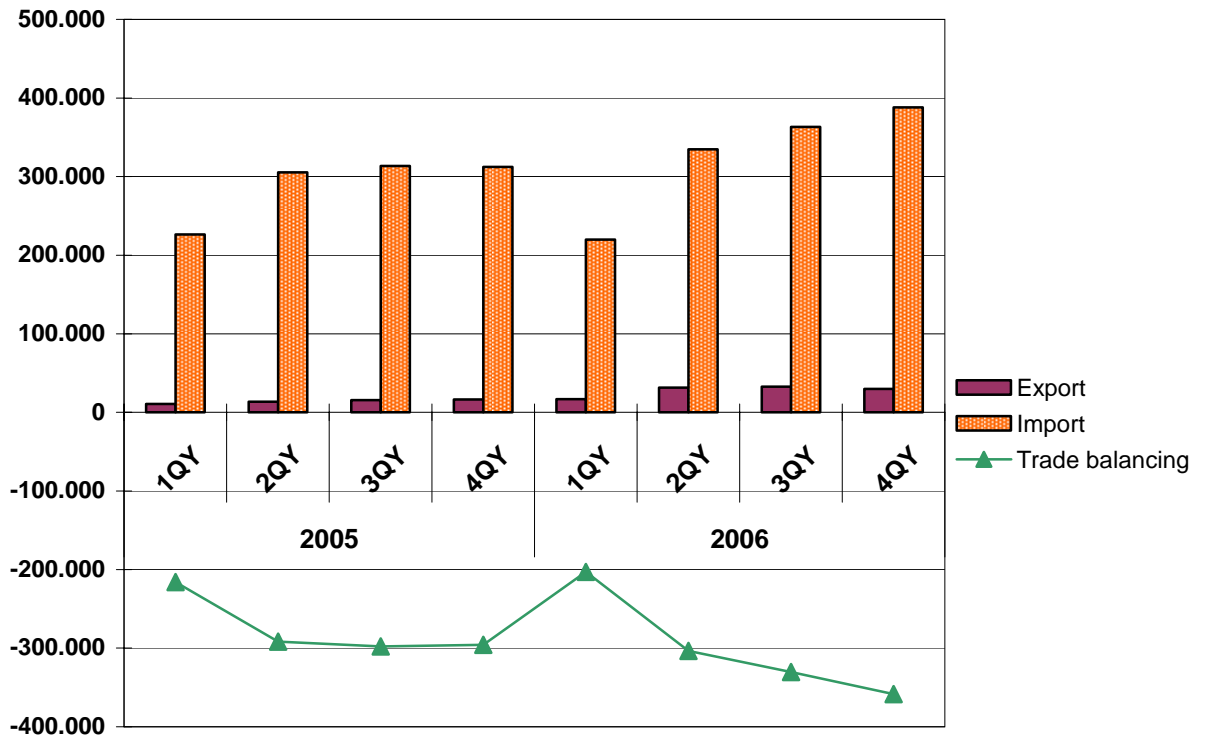

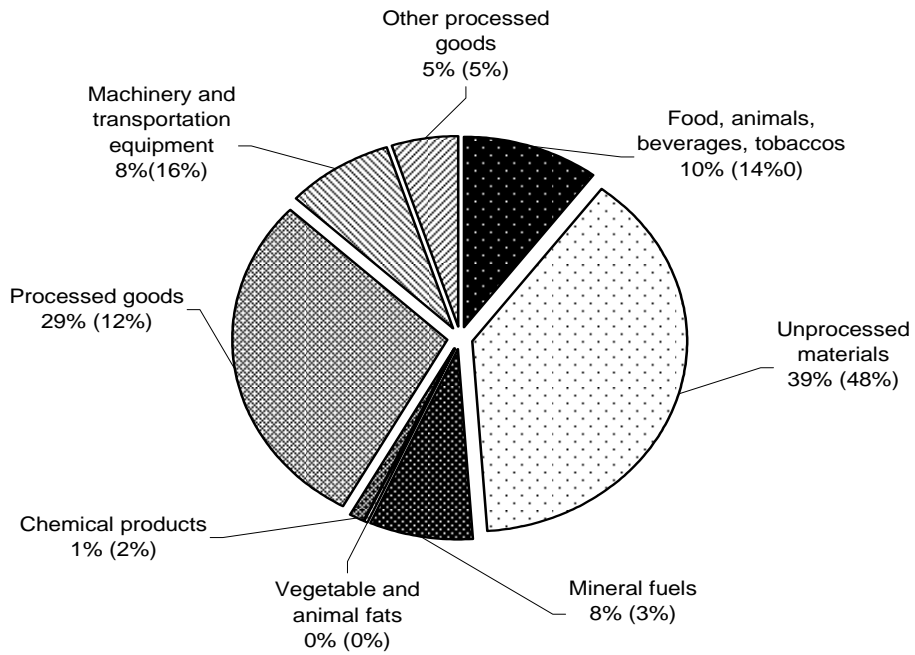

Graphic 4: Import by sections of SITC 2006 (2005)

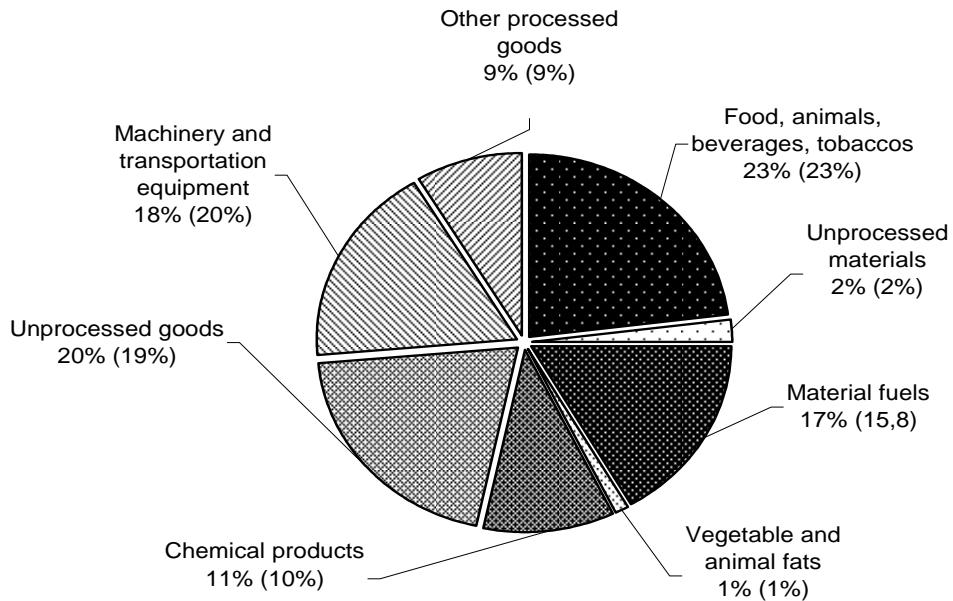

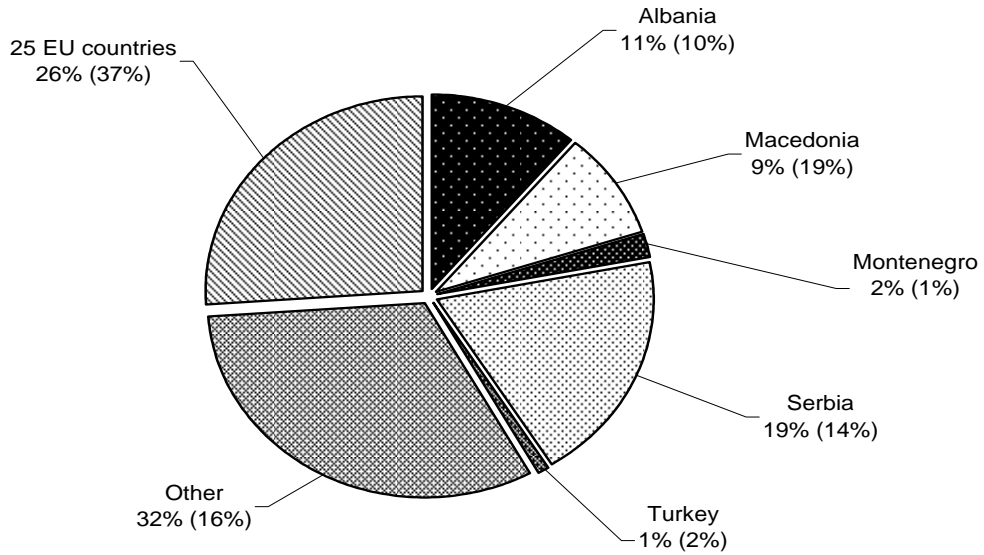

Graphic 6: Import by countries in rapport with the total of 2006 (2005)

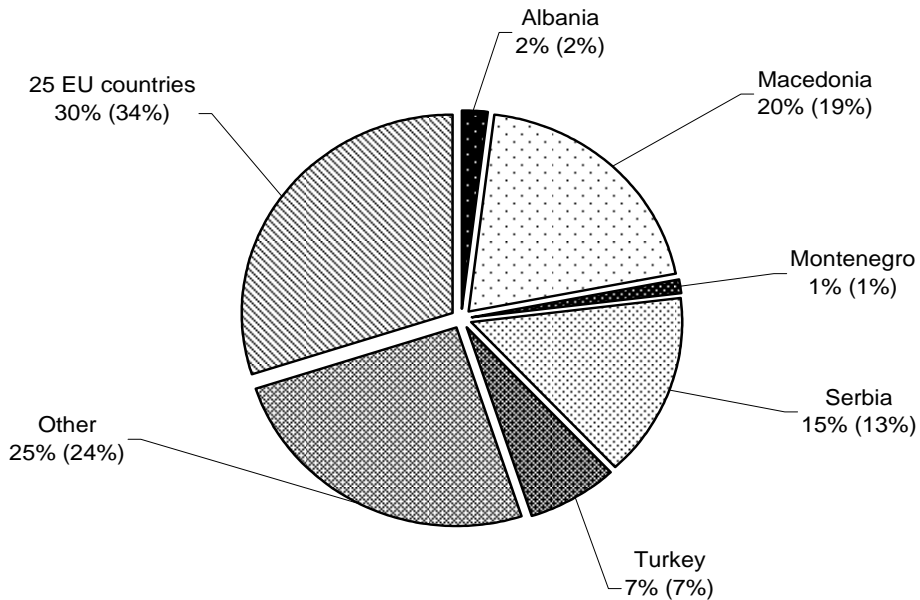

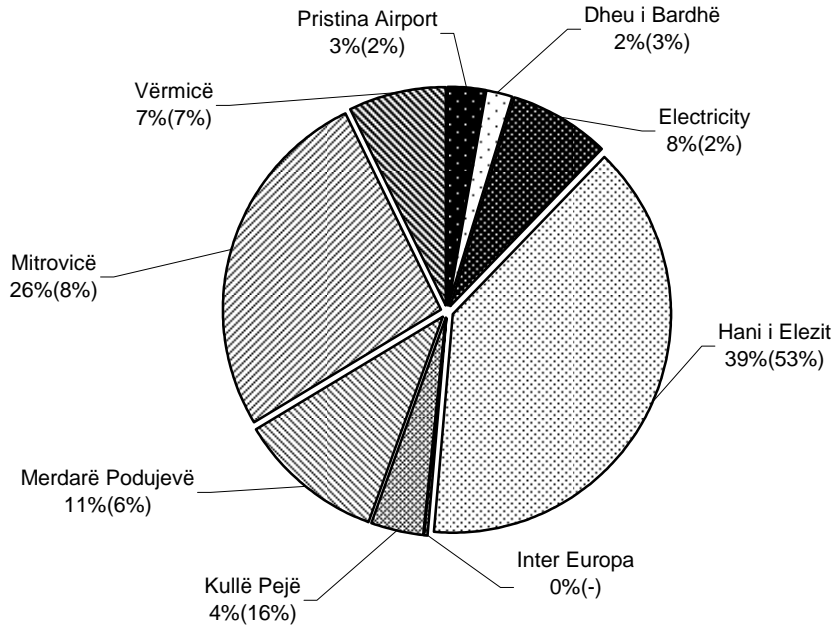

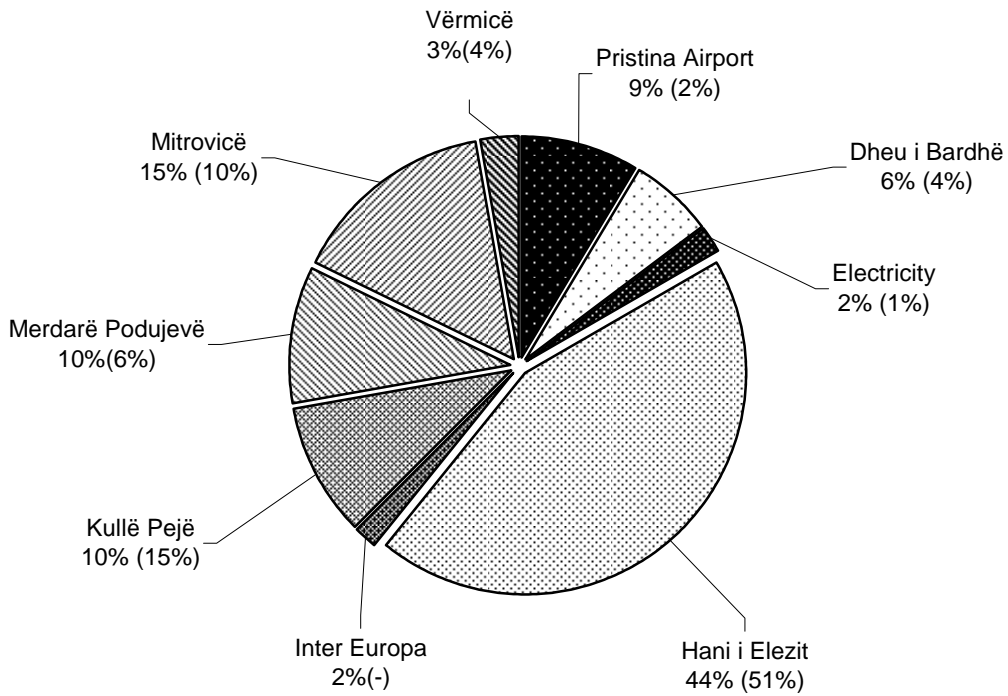

Statistical Office of Kosovo a brief description

The Statistical Office of Kosovo, Is a professional office operating since 1948, which passed through some of the historic phases; it has been structured by the state rule of that time. The Statistical Office of Kosovo restarted its work on August 2, 1999, as an independent and professional office in the frames of the Ministry of Public Services. The SOK is financed by the Kosovo Consolidated Budget and donors for various projects.

The Statistical Office of Kosovo acts pursuant the Regulation 2001/14, which entered into force on July 2, 2001. A medium-term Master Plan is being developed for the statistical system of Kosovo compatible with the European Statistics.

SOK Organization Structure; Composes of: four productive departments (Department of Economic Statistics and National Accounts, Department of Population Statistics, Department of Social Statistics and Department of Agricultural and Environment Statistics), seven Regional Offices (located in Gjakova, Gjilan, Mitrovica, Peja, Prizren, Pristina and Ferizaj), two support departments (Department of Methodology and Information Technology and Department of Administration), as well as the Office of the Census.

Total employees are 134, of them 96 (71.6%) within the SOK offices whilst 38 (28.4%) in regional offices.

There is also a support and cooperation with the international institutions.

Statistics Office of Kosovo covers Kosovo entirely. For implementation of the surveys in the field, the SOK uses appropriate sampling and methodology. During the collection of the reports from the reporting units, the SOK engages professionals, technicians, administrators and civilians from the local offices, and regional field registrations.

Recently, a team of national and international experts are working in the project of registration of the population.
