

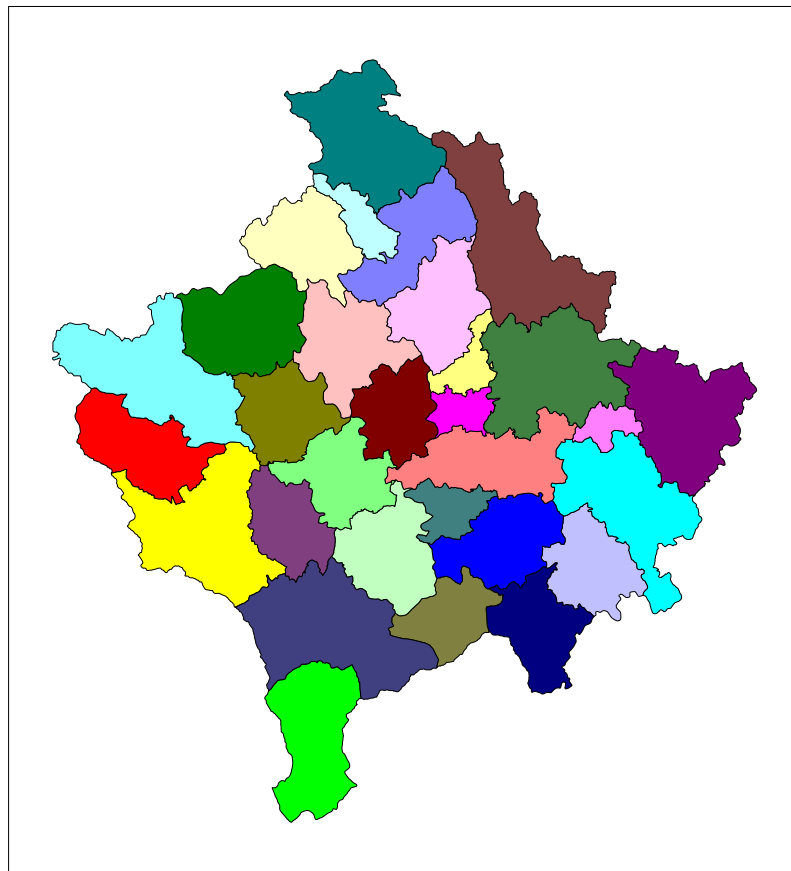

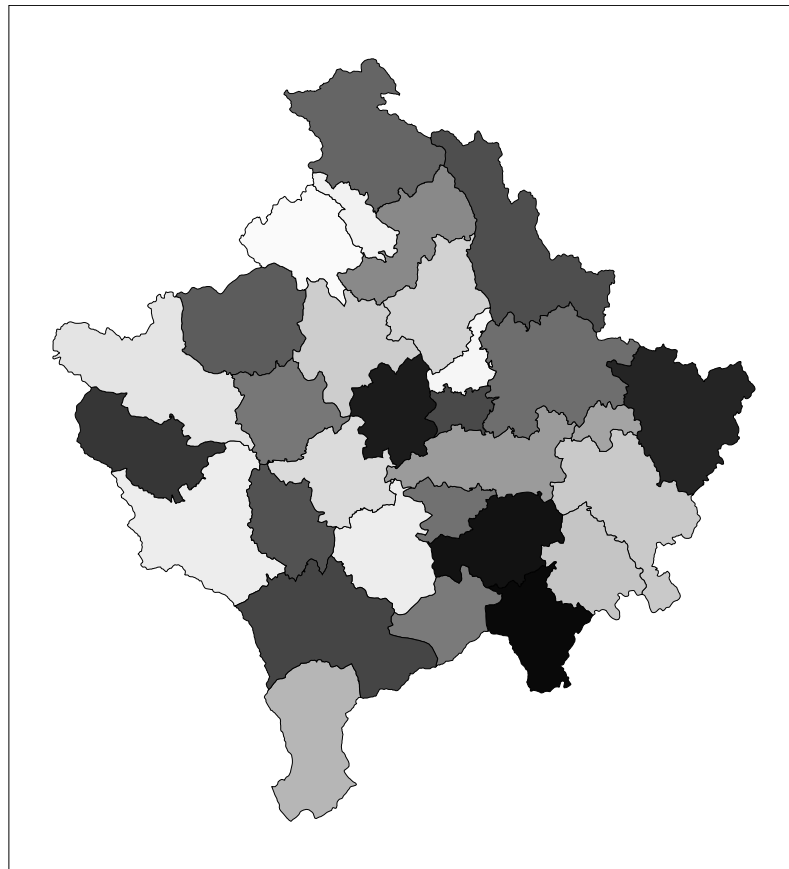


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F o r e w o r d

The Statistical Office of Kosovo (SOK) started to publish the data for the Import of Kosovo since 2001.

Publication of External Trade is based on the data provided by the Kosovo Customs Service and Kosovo Electric Corporation on electricity.

First preliminary data on Export are of years 2000 and 2001.

Data in this publication differs from the preliminary data published previously.

This annual publication composes of 26 tables for External Trade of Kosovo, with some comparisons with years 2007 - 2008. Tables are in regard of export and import according to the flow of goods, sections, countries, border points and articles.

Imports are presented according to the origin of the country.

Suggestions and remarks are welcomed.

Future publications will probably bring new data and a better quality.

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Export and Import flow during 2008

Analyzing the data for the period of 2002 - 2008, it can be notified that there is a permanent growth (increase) of export and import.

Trade deficit in 2008 was 1,729,7 million Euros which reflects a negative balance also in this year. The total of export in 2008 was 198,4 million euros, whilst the import was 1,928,2 million euros, the export covers the import 10.3%.

This publication gives more explanations and details on what our country imports from the external market and what exports to the external market (trade).

Comparing the data of 2008 with 2007 for some main groups of goods, it can be seen that the annual increase of the export is for 20.2% higher. The main components of the export for 2008 are: manufactured goods classified increasing from 50,6 million euros to 104,9 million euros (107.0%), chemical products increased from 1,3 million euros to 2,3 million euros (76.2%), beverages and tobaccos from 3,8 million euros to 5,8 million euros (49.4%), food and live animals increased from 14,2 million euros to 14.6 million euros (3.3%), and there is a decrease in the group of: machinery and transportation equipment from 22,6 million euros to 10,7 million euros (-52.7%), mineral fuels from 12,5 million euros to 8,3 million euros (-33.9%), crude materials from 53,5 million euros to 45,5 million euros (-14.8%), miscellaneous manufactured from 6,1 million euros to 6,0 million euros (-2.5%).

Regarding the imports, the annual increase in 2008 has been 22.3%. Main components of the imports are: mineral fuels from 258,3 million euro to 343,5 million euro (33.0%), animal and vegetable oils from 15.5 million euro to 20.1 million euro (29.8%), food and live animals from 272,4 million euro to 336,9 million euro (23.7%), machinery and transportation equipment from 294,3 million euro to 362,6 million euro (23.2%), beverages and tobaccos from 91,3 million euro in 110,4 million euro (20.9%), manufactured goods classified 307,6 million euro to 361,9 million euro (17.7%), chemical products increased from 156,4 million euro to 183,5 million euro (17.3%), miscellaneous manufactured from 143,6 million euro to 168,1 million euro (17.1%), crude materials from 36,4 million euro to 40,8 million euro (12.0%).

Regarding the export - import of Kosovo, the main trade partners are Balkan countries participating with 32.5% for export and 43.9% for import comparing with the total of the year 2008, while EU participation has been with 47.4% for export and 36,4% for import comparing with the total of the year 2008. Regarding the exports of Kosovo with Balkan countries, Albania participates with 10.6%, Macedonia with 10,1%, Serbia with 5.0%, comparing with the total of the year 2008, and the major participants of the imports in Kosovo from the Balkan countries are Macedonia with 18.0% ,Serbia with 10.8% and Turkey 6.7%.

External Trade Statistics – methodological notes

Sources

The statistics of trade is compiled mainly from the documents supplied by importers and exporters (or their agents) to the Customs authorities. The document is the *Single Administrative Document (SAD)* used for Customs clearance purposes. The information on the document is captured by the Customs Information system. The additional source of data are administrative data for imports and exports of electricity.

Responsibility for data collection, compilation and publication

The Customs Administration is responsible for the collection, inputting and processing of customs declarations data. SAD records with statistical fields are reported monthly to the Statistical Office by the Customs Administration on electronic media.

SOK is responsible for external trade data collection, compilation and publication. Statistics defines the coverage of statistics by kinds of customs procedures. The additional work involves editing and validation of customs data.

Coverage

External trade statistics does not cover temporary imports and exports of goods which will return after a certain period in an unchanged condition, services, repairs, money as means of payment, monetary gold, fuel supply of Kosovo's vehicles abroad, imports of goods for foreign liaisons and other diplomatic missions in Kosovo, personal baggage of travellers, commercial samples and postal packages of minor value.

Recording system

External trade statistics are compiled in accordance with the 'special' system(**relaxed definition**) of recording international trade. Under this system imports and exports are recorded at the time the goods are moved across the free circulation area, that is, the part within which goods may be disposed of without customs restriction. **Relaxed definition means** that beside regular import and export transactions also inward and outward processing are included.

Special imports consist of imports of foreign goods into the free circulation area for consumption, for processing and after outward processing.

Special exports include exports of goods originating in the free circulation area, goods after inward processing and goods for outward processing.

Goods in transit are excluded.

Valuation

For imports the *cif* value (inclusive of cost, insurance and freight to the point of entry to the Kosovo) is used. For exports the *fob* (free on board) value is used. This is the cost of goods to the purchaser abroad, including packing, transport in the State, loading charges, insurance and all other charges accruing up to the point where the goods are put on board the exporting vessel or aircraft or are conveyed to the land frontier. The invoice value is recalculated to the value at the Kosovo's border by adding or subtracting on whole or in part costs of transport, loading, unloading and insurance, depending on terms of delivery set down in the contract.

The value excludes:

- any sums receivable by the exporter by way of export refund, drawback, subsidy or other bounty
- any foreign customs duties or freight charges beyond the port or point of exportation.

Valuation is in euro. For transactions in which the value is expressed in a foreign currency, conversion to euro is done using the daily current exchange rate.

Reference period

The calendar month is the basic period for compiling the data. On the base of customs data the time of recording the imports/exports transactions is the date of submission of the customs declaration or according to some other date valid for the implementation of the customs regulations.

Units of quantity

The **quantity** of exported and imported goods is shown in net mass if it can be determined considering the nature of the product and in the supplementary unit of measurement when it is prescribed in the customs tariff nomenclature.

Net weight is the usual unit of quantity shown. The weight of containers, cases, jars and packing materials is therefore excluded.

Other units of quantity are used for some commodities, notably live animals, motor vehicles, office machines, domestic appliances, watches and clocks, and clothing (where number is used as the unit of quantity), footwear (where the number of pairs is used), floor coverings (where square metres are used), and beverages (where volume is used).

Partner country

In this publication, imports are recorded *by country of origin* (as opposed to country of consignment or dispatch). Goods obtained or produced in one country originated in that country. A product, in the production of which two or more countries were concerned, is considered as originating in the country in which the last substantial manufacturing process was done. Packing, repacking, sorting and blending are not regarded as manufacturing processes.

Exports are classified *by country of final destination*. The last country to which the goods are specifically directed on their outward movement from the State is regarded as their final destination. This is not necessarily the country in which the goods will be unshipped or that in which they will be finally consumed.

Country classification

The classification of countries is the country nomenclature (Geonomenclature) as set out annually in the Official Journal of the European Communities. From January 1999, this follows the United Nations' ISO alpha-2 coding system, in which each country is identified by a two letter code.

Commodity classification

Statistics are collected using the 8-digit Combined Nomenclature (CN) – the EU's tariff and statistical nomenclature. This nomenclature is managed and updated annually by the Commission in co-operation with the member states. The CN is aligned with the 6-digit Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System (HS) – the nomenclature of the Customs Co-operation Council that is used throughout the world for applying customs tariffs and compiling external trade statistics. The CN contains about 10,400 8-digit subheadings, the first six digits of which correspond to the HS code.

The Standard International Trade Classification, Revision 3 (SITC Rev 3) has been developed by the United Nations for the advancement of the international comparability of statistics on external trade.

SITC Rev 3 contains about 3,100 basic headings (5-digit). These are combined into 261 Groups (3-digit), 98 Divisions (2-digit) and 10 Sections (1-digit). For example, Section 6 (Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material) consists of 9 Divisions, 61 to 69. Division 64 (Paper, paperboard and

articles thereof) consists of two groups, 641 and 642, which together consist of 72 basic headings, such as 642.94 (Paper handkerchiefs, towels, tablecloths, garments etc).

SITC Rev 3 follows the structure of the HS. Each of the categories in the SITC (including all the basic headings) is equivalent to a combination of HS headings (and therefore to a combination of CN headings)

The unit value index

Definition and compilation method

The unit value is the average value (not the price of the determined value) per quantity unit (kg) of all products classified under the same eight-digit code of the customs tariff nomenclature. In case when not only one product but more products of various kinds or various quality are classified into one code number of the customs tariff nomenclature, the relative change of the unit value can reflect the change of price as well as the change of composition or quality of goods. Therefore, the aggregated external trade unit value indices, calculated for larger groups of goods, can be used as approximate estimates of price development in external trade and as deflators.

The unit value method of index calculation is one of the established methods of price indices calculations and is used in external trade statistics in line with the recommendations of the United Nations Statistical Office.

External trade unit value indices are calculated in Euro according to the statistical value of goods on the day of the customs clearance of export or import of goods. The statistical value of goods is the value of goods on the Kosovo border (adding value of costs insurance and freight – CIF or FOB).

External trade unit value indices are calculated as chain indices by the Laspeyeres (I_l), Paasches (I_p) and Fisher (I_f) formulas.

They are published as the Fisher indices.

P1 – unit value at the commodity level of the customs tariff nomenclature in the current year

P0 - unit value at the commodity level of the customs tariff nomenclature in the base year

Q1 - quantity value at the commodity level of the customs tariff nomenclature in the current year

Q0 - quantity value at the commodity level of the customs tariff nomenclature in the base year

In the procedure of the external trade unit value indices calculation various methods for data quality control and improvement of results are used. Eliminated from calculation are those individual customs declarations:

- in which there is no quantity or statistical value
- with only one customs declaration in the reference period
- whose unit value index is above the upper limit or below the lower limit (the limits are set on experience basis and agree with international praxis)

It is possible to exclude all customs declarations for goods that show an “unusual” price development or are otherwise considered not suitable for index calculation (e.g. typical seasonal products which price is not representative for calculations)

Dissemination of data

Monthly data are **provisional until** the release of final data and are published 45 days after the reference month.

Annual data are published twice: the first time as provisional data within the regular time delay and the second time as final data (in June for the previous year).

Graph 1: Graph presentation of goods flow on external trade

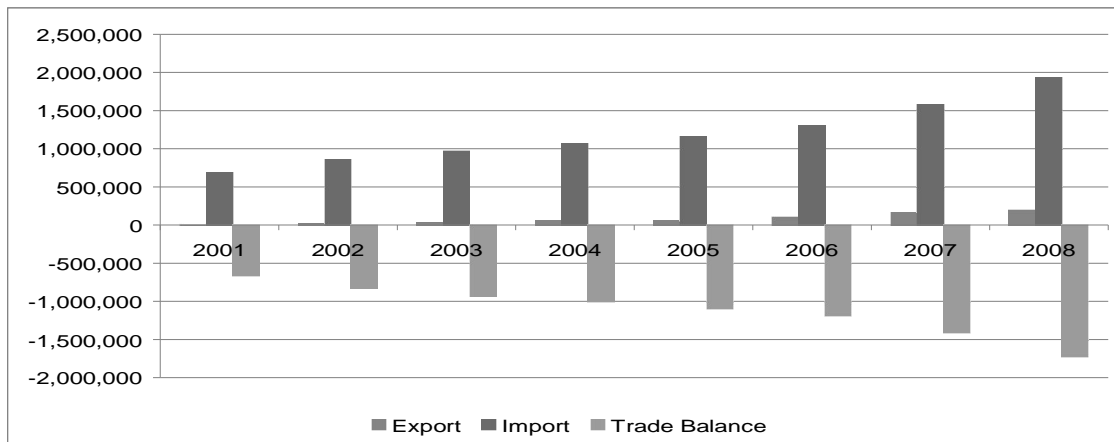

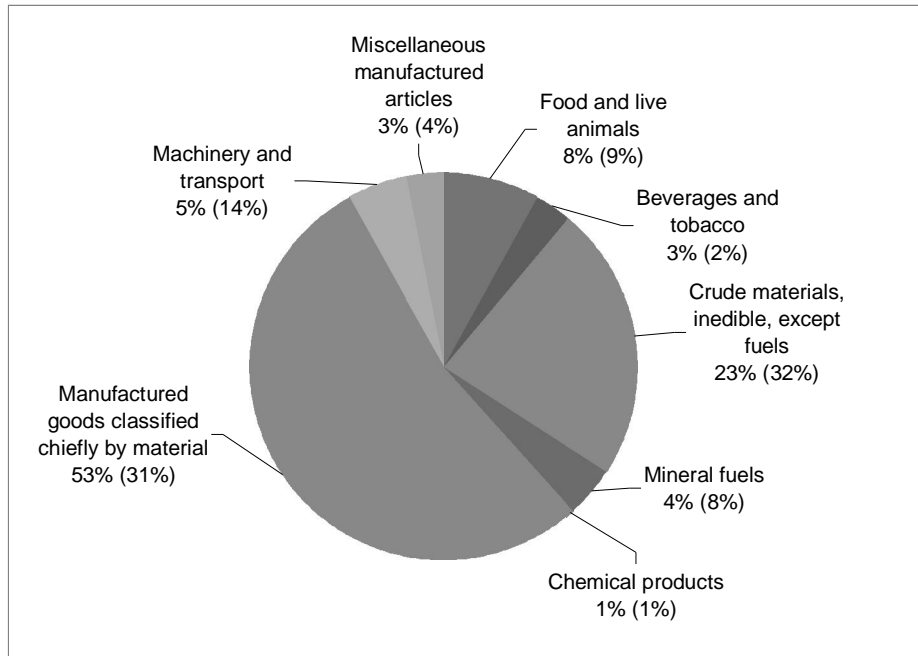

Graphic 3: Import by sections of SITC 2008 (2007)

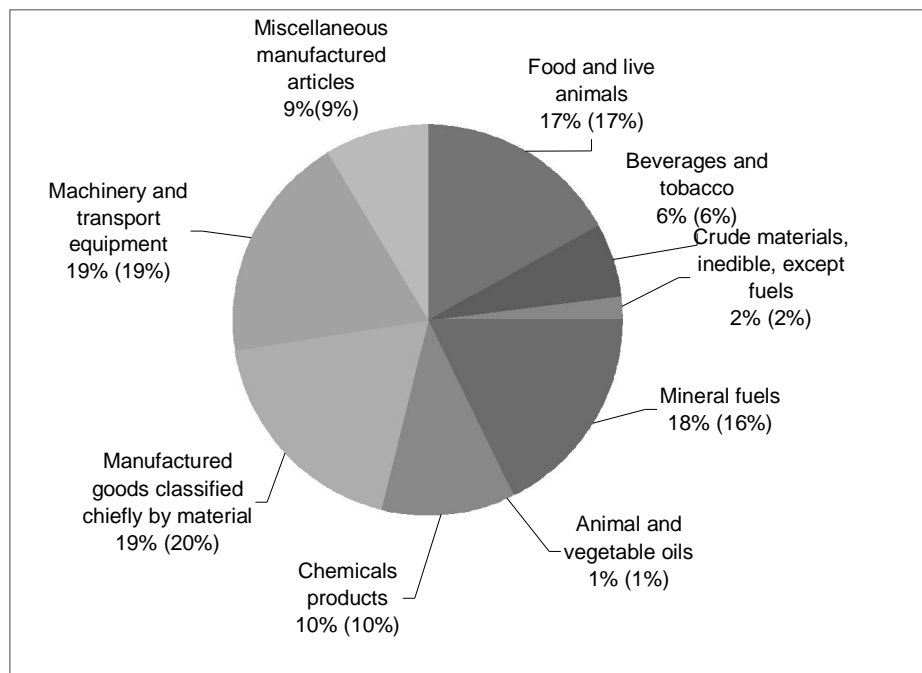

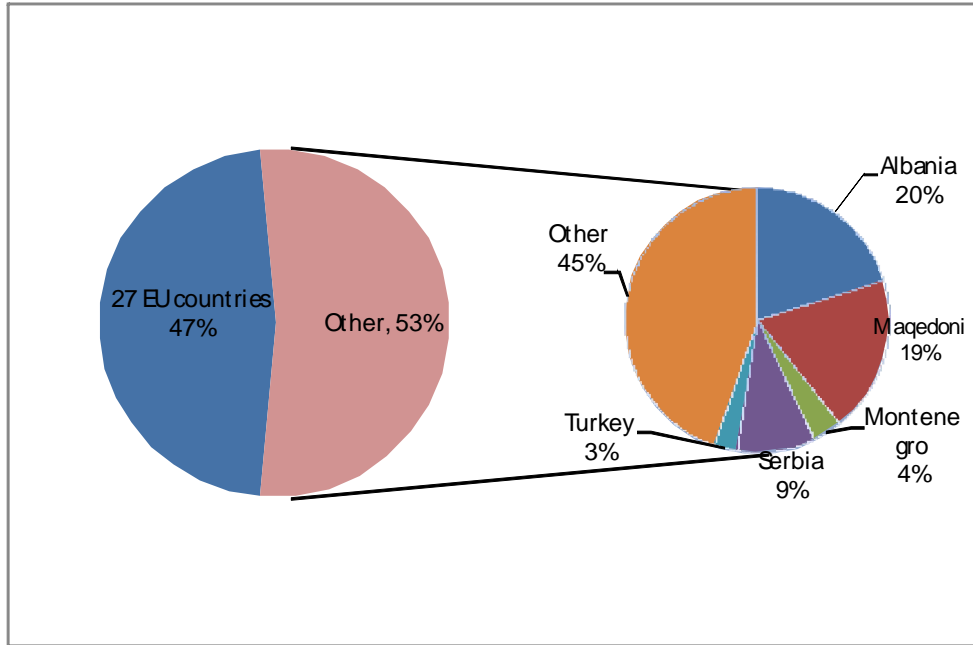

Graphic 5: The main trade partners for export 2008

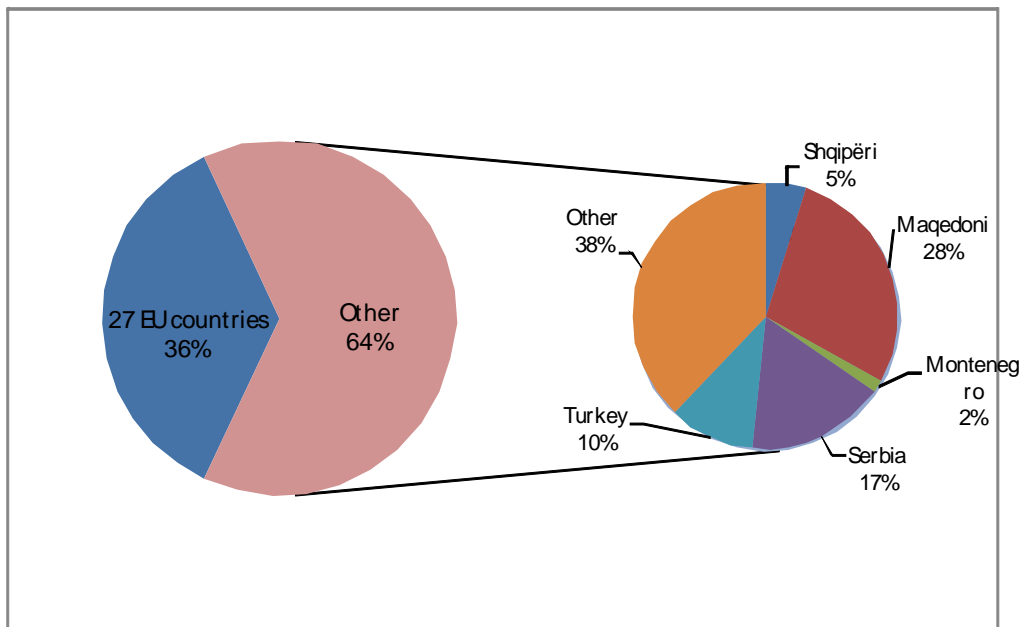

Graphic 6: Main partners in Kosovo in 2008

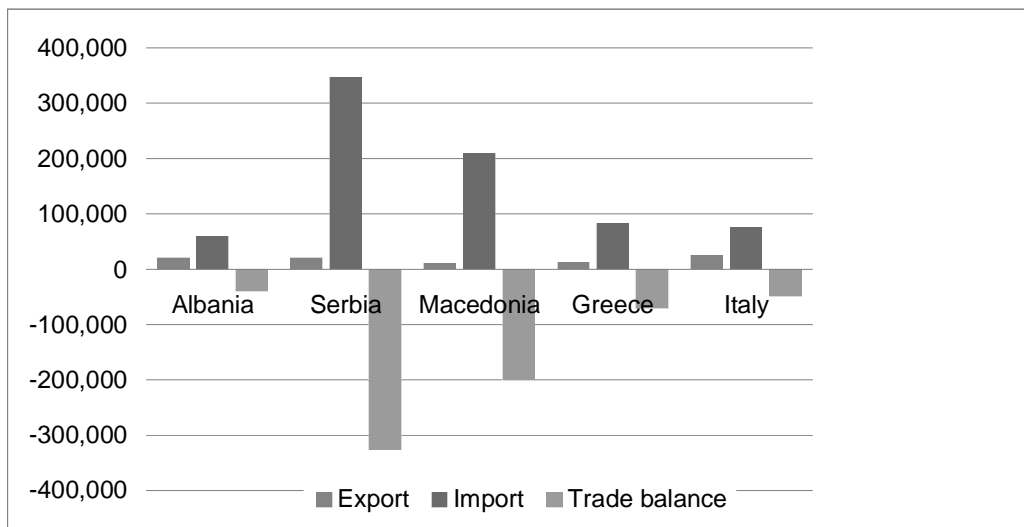
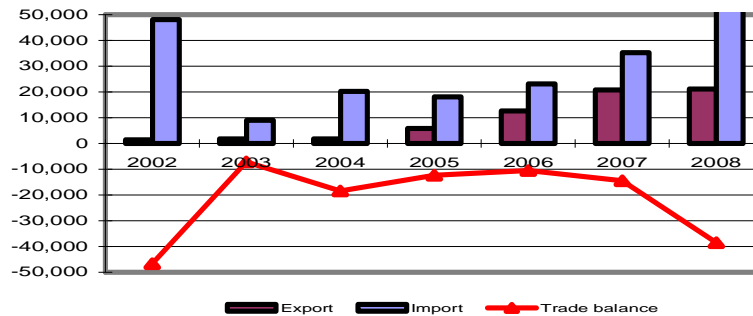

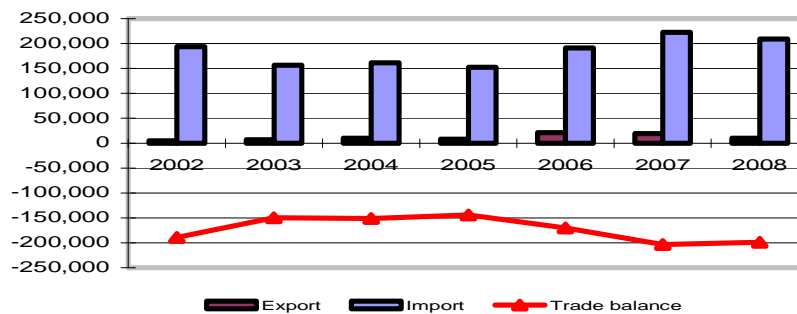

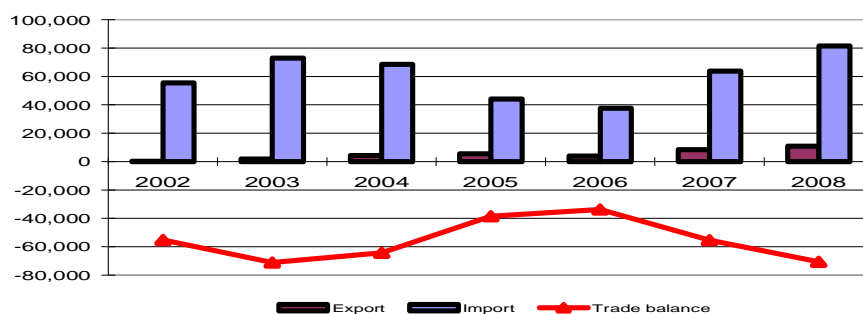

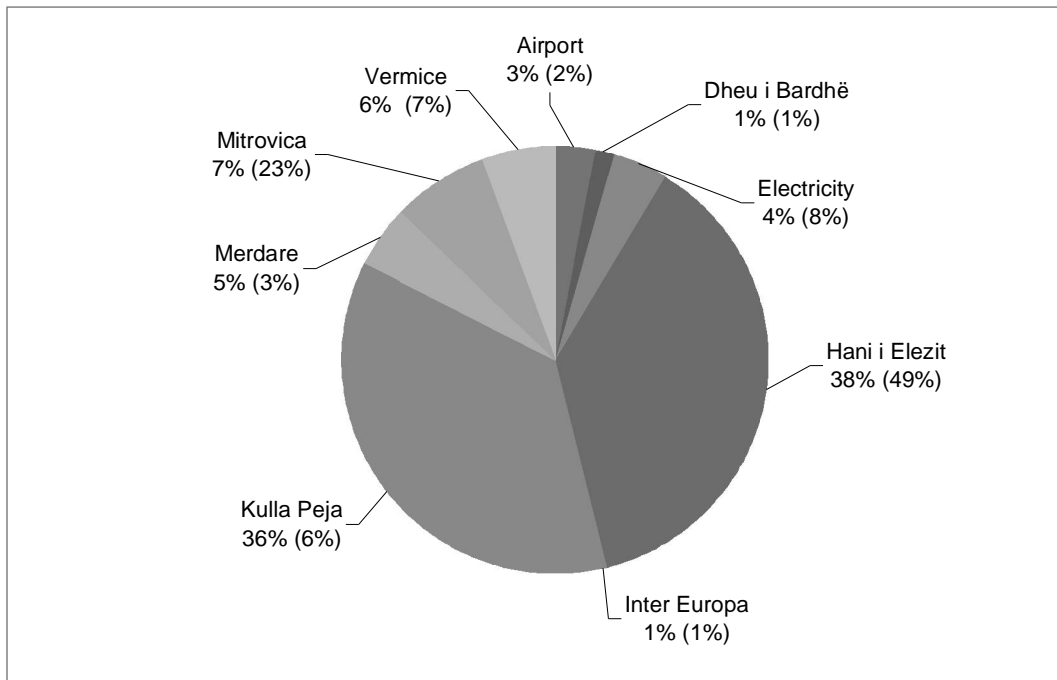

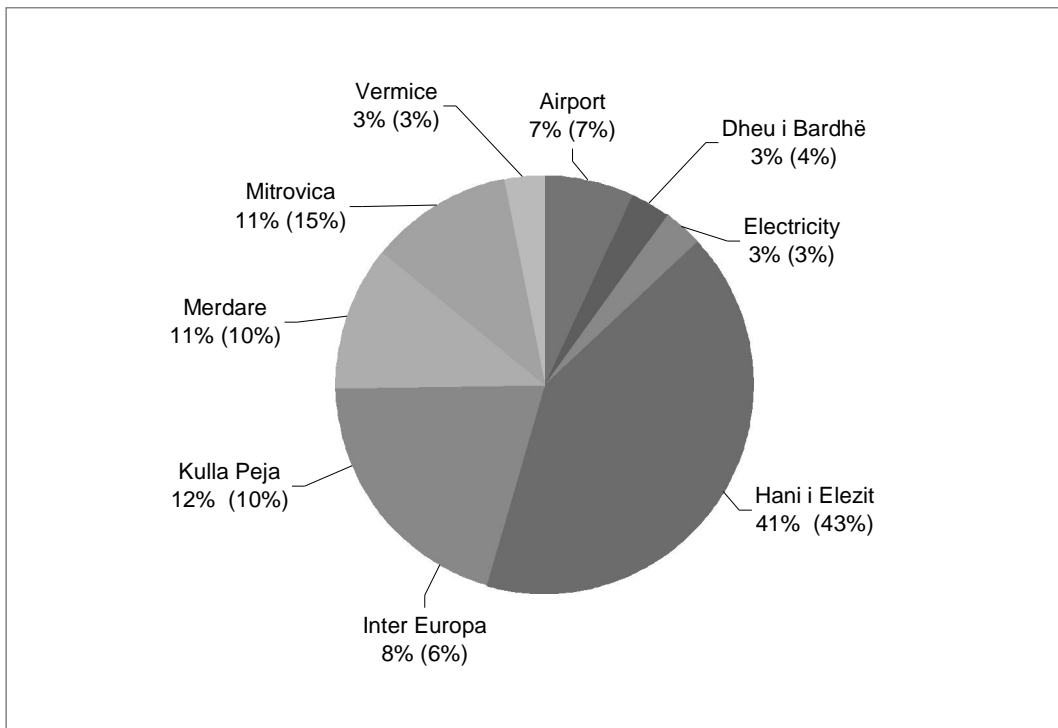

Statistical Office of Kosovo, a brief description

The Statistical Office of Kosovo (SOK) is a professional office operating since 1948. The SOK passed through some of the historic phases and it has been structured by the state rule of that time. SOK restarted its work on August 2, 1999, as an independent and professional office working in the frames of the Ministry of Public Administration (MPA). SOK is financed by the Kosovo Consolidated Budget and by donors for the various projects.

The Statistical Office of Kosovo acts pursuant the UNMIK Regulation 2001/14 that entered into force on July 2, 2001. A medium-term Master Plan is being developed for the statistical system of Kosovo compatible with the European Statistics.

The SOK Organization Structure; composes of four departments for production of statistics (Department of Economic Statistics and National Accounts, Department of Population Statistics, Department of Social Statistics and Department of Agricultural and Environment Statistics), seven Regional Offices (located in Gjakova, Gjilan, Mitrovica, Peja, Prizren, Pristina and Ferizaj), two support departments (Department of Methodology and Information Technology, and Department of Administration), as well as the Office of the Population Census.

Total number employees is 134, of them 96 (71.6%) within the SOK offices whilst 38 (28.4%) in regional offices.

There is also a support and cooperation with the international institutions.

The Statistical Office of Kosova covers Kosovo entirely. For implementation of the surveys in the field, the SOK uses appropriate sampling and methodology approach. In the collection of the reports from the reporting units, the SOK engages professionals, technicians, administrators and civilians form the local offices and regional field population census.

Recently, a team of national and international experts is working in the project of the population census.

SOK Mission is to fulfill the needs of the users with the reliable statistical data and with regular analyses in order to support and provide government departments with the proper information for decision-making process including other users as well.

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
