
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F o r e w o r d

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1 Geographical information about Kosovo

The Republic of Kosovo has an area of 10,908 km², located on the south-eastern Europe, bordering Albania in south-west, Montenegro in northwest, Serbia to the north-east and Macedonia to south.

The territory lies within the latitude 41° 51' and 43° 16', and in longitude 19° 59' and 21° 47'.


The territory of the Republic of Kosovo is characterized by different heights above sea level. The lowest point of Kosovo is located in the valley of the river Drini on the border with Albania and reaches up to 270m above sea level, the higher point is in western Kosovo in Gjeravica - 2.656m.

In hydrographic terms, Kosovo is divided into river basins: the Drini i Bardhë, Ibri, Morava Binqës and Lepeneci. Kosovo river's flows into three sea basins: the Black Sea, Adriatic Sea and the Aegean Sea.

Climate of the Republic of Kosovo in the most part is continental, resulting in warm summers and cold winters, with Mediterranean and continental influences (average temperature within the country range from +30° C in summer, at -10° C in winter). However, due to unequal elevations in certain parts of the country, there are changes in temperature and rainfall distribution.

Administrative division of Kosovo

Currently there are 38 municipalities with 1,469 settlements organized under the laws of the country.







Graph 2: Number of children, pupils and students in public and private education 2014/2015



Graph 3. Number of children, pupils and students in public and private education 2015/2016





Graph 4. Number of teachers by level of education in public education 2014/2015



Graph 5. Number of teachers by level of education in public education 2015/2016







Graph 7. Social assistance



Graph 8. Families of martyrs and war invalids 2014



Graph 9. Basic pensions 2014-2015



Graph 10. Contribution pensions 2014-2015



Graph 11. Pensions of persons with special needs 2014-2015



Graph 12: Abandoned children by region and month in 2014-2015





Graph 13: Gender structure of employees in health institutions









Graph 17: Number of juveniles convicted in first instance courts by gender, observed in years 2013/2015





The main source of income is wages from regular employment, which make up about half of overall revenue. The second source is income from agriculture by 14 percent, then ranks income from businesses that make 11 percent of total revenues. About 4 percent are earned from temporary work. Salaries of regular employment are more important for women than for men, but the income from own business are more important for men (13 percent) than for women (3 percent). Pensions from Kosovo by 17 percent compared to only 6 percent for males constitute the source of the second most important income for women. The third important source for women are cash from abroad by 10 percent compared with 6 percent for men. Important source of income for men is agriculture with 18 percent, while only 1 percent for women.



In Kosovo, the data show that in 2014 the average municipal waste collected was 140 kg per capita per year. 



Graph 22: Categorization of roads by standards







14 Prices







Graph 27: Graphical presentation of weights according to COICOP groups in percentage for 2015



Graph 28: Development of Producer Price Index (PPI) Q1 2009 - Q4 2015



Graph 29: Development of IPI, Q1 2006 – Q4 2015 (2010=100)




