





Graph 2. Number of children, pupils and students in public and private education 2012/2013





Graph 4. Number of teachers at all levels in public and private education 2012/2013







Graph 7. Social support



Graph 8. Families of martyrs and war invalids 2013



Graph 9. Basic pensions 2013



Graph 10. Pensions contributors 2013



Graph 11. Pensions of persons with special needs 2013



Graph 12: Abandoned children according to region and month 2013





Graph 13: Gender structure of employees in health institutions













Graph 19. Road categorization according to standards









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



Graph 24. Graphic weight according to COICOP groups for 2013



Graph 25: PPI development, first quarter 2008 – fourth quarter 2013 (2007=100)



Graph 26: IPI development, Q1 2006 – Q4 2013 (2008=100)




